8	(b-2) A professional providing prenatal, mental health, or
9	other medical care to a woman who voluntarily discloses to the
10	professional that the woman illegally used a controlled substance,
11	as defined by Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code, during pregnancy
12	is not required to make a report under this section if:
13	(1) the woman provides proof that:
14	(A) she is currently enrolled in or has recently
15	completed a substance abuse treatment program; or
16	(B) she made reasonable efforts to enroll in a
17	substance abuse program within five days of the date she made a
18	disclosure described by this subsection; or
19	(2) the professional determines:
20	(A) there is no immediate risk of harm to the
21	child from the exposure to the controlled substance; and
22	(B) the woman does not otherwise pose an
23	immediate risk of harm to the child.

Except as provided by Subsection (a-1), with [With] 3 (a) assistance from the appropriate state or local law enforcement 4 5 agency as provided by this section, the department shall make a prompt and thorough investigation of a report of child abuse or 6 7 neglect allegedly committed by a person responsible for a child's 8 care, custody, or welfare. The investigation shall be conducted 9 without regard to any pending suit affecting the parent-child relationship. 10

11 <u>(a-1) The department may not investigate a report of child</u> 12 <u>abuse or neglect allegedly committed by a woman based on the woman's</u> 13 <u>illegal use of a controlled substance, as defined by Chapter 481,</u> 14 <u>Health and Safety Code, during pregnancy if the woman enrolls in and</u> 15 <u>successfully completes a substance abuse treatment program under</u> 16 <u>the supervision of the referring or treating professional.</u>
