8	(b-2) A professional providing prenatal, mental health, or
9	other medical care to a woman who voluntarily discloses to the
10	professional that the woman illegally used a controlled substance,
11	as defined by Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code, during pregnancy
12	is not required to make a report under this section if:
13	(1) the woman enrolls in or has successfully completed
14	a substance abuse treatment program; or
15	(2) the professional determines:
16	(A) there is no immediate risk of harm to the
17	child from the exposure to the controlled substance; and
18	(B) the woman does not otherwise pose ar
19	immediate risk of harm to the child.
20	SECTION 2. Section 261.301, Family Code, is amended by
21	amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as

- 2 prompt and thorough investigation of a report of child abuse or

- 7 (a-1) The department may not investigate a report of child

- 9 illegal use of a controlled substance, as defined by Chapter 481,
- 10 Health and Safety Code, during pregnancy if the woman enrolls in and
- 11 successfully completes a substance abuse treatment program under
- 12 the supervision of the referring or treating professional.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
