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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a student experience study for public school students. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 4.001(b), Education Code, is amended to 4 5 read as follows: The objectives of public education are: 6 (b) 7 OBJECTIVE 1: Parents will be full partners with educators in the education of their children. 8 OBJECTIVE 2: Students will be encouraged and challenged to 9 10 meet their full educational potential. 11 OBJECTIVE 3: Through enhanced dropout prevention efforts, 12 all students will remain in school until they obtain a high school 13 diploma. 14 OBJECTIVE 4: A well-balanced and appropriate curriculum will be provided to all students. Through that curriculum, students 15 16 will be prepared to succeed in a variety of postsecondary 17 activities, including employment and enrollment in institutions of higher education. 18 OBJECTIVE 5: Educators will prepare students 19 to be thoughtful, active citizens who have an appreciation for the basic 20 21 values of our state and national heritage and who can understand and productively function in a free enterprise society. 22 23 OBJECTIVE 6: Qualified and highly effective personnel will be recruited, developed, and retained. 24

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OBJECTIVE 7: The state's students will demonstrate exemplary
performance in comparison to national and international standards.

3 OBJECTIVE 8: School campuses will maintain a safe and 4 disciplined environment conducive to student learning.

5 OBJECTIVE 9: Educators will keep abreast of the development 6 of creative and innovative techniques in instruction and 7 administration using those techniques as appropriate to improve 8 student learning.

9 OBJECTIVE 10: Technology will be implemented and used to 10 increase the effectiveness of student learning, instructional 11 management, staff development, and administration.

OBJECTIVE 11: The State Board of Education, the agency, and the commissioner shall assist school districts and charter schools in providing career and technology education to students.

15 <u>OBJECTIVE 12:</u> Students will be partners with educators and 16 <u>administrators in the design, delivery, and success of the</u> 17 <u>students' education.</u>

SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 7, Education Code, is amended by adding Sections 7.041 and 7.042 to read as follows:

20 <u>Sec. 7.041. STUDENT EXPERIENCE STUDY. (a) Not less than</u> 21 <u>once every two years, the agency shall commission a statewide study</u> 22 <u>of student experience that must:</u>

23	(1) evaluate student experience relating to:
24	(A) teacher effectiveness;
25	(B) campus culture and climate;
26	(C) postgraduate readiness;
27	(D) mental health;

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1	(E) partnership and agency in decision-making;
2	(F) safety;
3	(G) discipline; and
4	(H) rigor and effectiveness;
5	(2) report information disaggregated by every student
6	subpopulation identified by the agency that includes more than 25
7	students;
8	(3) use multiple modes of gathering quantitative and
9	qualitative data, including surveys, one-on-one interviews, and
10	focus groups;
11	(4) involve students in the planning and
12	implementation of the study; and
13	(5) include a representative sample set of suitable
14	size and diversity in terms of geography, income, race, learning
15	differences, and language abilities.
16	(b) Using the results of the statewide student experience
17	survey commissioned under Subsection (a), the agency shall:
18	(1) identify and track progress toward statewide
19	student experience goals;
20	(2) provide recommendations to the legislature
21	regarding allocation of educational resources;
22	(3) provide analysis of the effects of prior state
23	legislative enactments applicable to student experience; and
24	(4) provide coaching opportunities to school
25	districts whose students participate in the study.
26	(c) The results of the statewide student experience study
27	commissioned under Subsection (a) may not be used for purposes of

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1	determining compensation for teachers.
2	(d) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year,
3	the agency shall submit a report that includes the results of the
4	latest statewide experience study commissioned under Subsection
5	(a) and any associated recommendations to:
6	(1) the governor and each member of the legislature;
7	and
8	(2) the superintendent and the president of the board
9	of trustees of each school district in this state.
10	Sec. 7.042. STUDENT PARTNERSHIP IN EDUCATION. The agency
11	shall:
12	(1) ensure decision-makers at state and local levels
13	are equipped to partner with students in the design, delivery, and
14	success of the students' education;
15	(2) direct the board of trustees of each school
16	district to establish and monitor progress toward at least one goal
17	relating to student experience;
18	(3) develop or adopt and disseminate tools for school
19	districts to assess the extent to which they are partnering with
20	students in the design, delivery, and success of students'
21	education;
22	(4) develop and provide training to school district
23	leaders, educators, and students regarding the facilitation of
24	partnerships between students and adults in the school
25	administration and measures for determining the success of student
26	education; and
27	(5) develop and provide training for boards of

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trustees of school districts regarding methods to use students as partners in the process of governing the boards' districts.

3 SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2022, the Texas 4 Education Agency shall submit the first report that includes the 5 results of the statewide student experience study and any 6 associated recommendations as required by Section 7.041, Education 7 Code, as added by this Act.

8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
