- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 271.021, Local Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Subdivision (5) to read as follows:
- 7 (5) "Small business" means a small business concern as
- 8 defined by the United States Small Business Administration under 15
- 9 U.S.C. Section 632.
- SECTION 2. Section 271.025(a), Local Government Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) The governmental entity must advertise for bids. The
- 13 advertisement for bids must include a notice that:
- 14 (1) describes the work;
- 15 (2) states the location at which the bidding
- 16 documents, plans, specifications, or other data may be examined by
- 17 all bidders; [and]
- 18 (3) states the time and place for submitting bids and
- 19 the time and place that bids will be opened; and
- 20 <u>(4) if Section 271.0255 applies to the contract,</u>
- 21 states that only a small business may bid on the contract.
- 22 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 271, Local Government
- 23 Code, is amended by adding Section 271.0255 to read as follows:
- Sec. 271.0255. SMALL BUSINESS PROGRAM. (a)

- 1 Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, the governing
- 2 body of a governmental entity may establish a program to limit
- 3 bidding on certain contracts to bidders that are small businesses.
- 4 (b) The governing body of a governmental entity that
- 5 establishes a program under this section may accept bids on a
- 6 contract only from bidders that are small businesses if:
- 7 (1) the governing body determines the contract is
- 8 appropriate for performance by a small business; and
- 9 (2) the contract requires an expenditure of not more
- 10 than \$1 million.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
