- 6 SECTION 1. Section 17.46, Business & Commerce Code, is

- 14 electricity, or another necessity at an exorbitant or excessive
- 15 price; or
- 16 (B) demanding an exorbitant or excessive price in
- 17 connection with the sale or lease of fuel, food, medicine, lodging,
- 18 building materials, construction tools, natural gas, electricity,
- 19 or another necessity;
- SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 21 an act or practice that occurs on or after the effective date of
- 22 this Act. An act or practice that occurs before the effective date
- 23 of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the act or
- 24 practice occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for

- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
