A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the development by the Public Utility Commission of Texas of physical security and cybersecurity practices for certain 3 utilities. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter B, Chapter 6 31, 7 Utilities Code, is amended to read as follows: SUBCHAPTER B. PHYSICAL SECURITY AND CYBERSECURITY 8 9 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 31.052, Utilities Code, is amended to read as follows: 10 11 Sec. 31.052. PHYSICAL SECURITY AND CYBERSECURITY 12 COORDINATION PROGRAM FOR UTILITIES. SECTION 3. Section 31.052(a), Utilities Code, is amended to 13 read as follows: 14 (a) The commission shall establish a program to monitor and 15 16 support physical security and cybersecurity efforts among 17 utilities in this state. The program shall: 18 (1) provide guidance, technical assistance, and training on best practices in physical security and cybersecurity 19 and facilitate the sharing of cybersecurity information between 20 21 utilities; [and] 22 (2) provide guidance, technical assistance, and 23 training on best practices for physical security and cybersecurity controls for supply chain risk management of cybersecurity systems 24

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1 used by utilities, which may include, as applicable, best practices related to: 2 3 (A) software integrity and authenticity; 4 (B) vendor risk management and procurement controls, including notification by vendors of incidents related to 5 the vendor's products and services; and 6 7 (C) vendor remote access; 8 (3) develop models, assessments, and auditing procedures for a utility to self-assess physical security and 9 10 cybersecurity; and (4) provide opportunities for utilities to share with 11 12 each other best practices for and information on physical security and cybersecurity. 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021. 18

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
