A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to a criminal offense committed against a person because

3 of bias or prejudice on the basis of gender identity or expression.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Monica Roberts Act.
- 6 SECTION 2. Articles 42.014(a) and (c), Code of Criminal
- 7 Procedure, are amended to read as follows:

- 8 (a) In the trial of an offense under Title 5, Penal Code, or
- 9 Section 28.02, 28.03, or 28.08, Penal Code, the judge shall make an
- 10 affirmative finding of fact and enter the affirmative finding in
- 11 the judgment of the case if at the guilt or innocence phase of the
- 12 trial, the judge or the jury, whichever is the trier of fact,
- 13 determines beyond a reasonable doubt that the defendant
- 14 intentionally selected the person against whom the offense was
- 15 committed, or intentionally selected the person's property that was
- 16 damaged or affected as a result of the offense, because of the
- 17 defendant's bias or prejudice against a group identified by race,
- 18 color, disability, religion, national origin or ancestry, age,
- 19 gender, [or] sexual preference, or gender identity or expression or
- 20 by status as a peace officer or judge.
- 21 (c) In this article:
- 22 <u>(1) "Gender identity or expression" means having or</u>
- 23 being perceived as having a gender-related identity, appearance,
- 24 expression, or behavior, regardless of whether that identity,

- 1 appearance, expression, or behavior is different from that commonly
- 2 associated with the person's actual or perceived sex. The term
- 3 includes being or being perceived as being transgender.
- 4 (2) "Sexual [, "sexual] preference" has the following
- 5 meaning only: a preference for heterosexuality, homosexuality, or
- 6 bisexuality.
- 7 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 8 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 9 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 10 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 11 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 12 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 13 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 14 before that date.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
