3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 48.106, Education Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 48.106. CAREER AND TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION ALLOTMENT.
7	(a) For each full-time equivalent student in average daily
8	attendance in an approved career and technology education program
9	in grades 7 through 12, a district is entitled to :
10	(1) an annual allotment equal to the basic allotment
11	multiplied by a weight the largest of the following weights for
12	which the time included as a full-time equivalent student
13	qualifies: of 1.35; and
14	(2) \$50 for each of the following in which the student
15	is enrolled .
16	(A) two or more advanced career and technology
17	education classes for a total of three or more credits ;

	(B) a campus designated as a P-TECH school under
19	Section 29.556; or
20	(C) a campus that is a member of the New Tech
21	Network and that focuses on project-based learning and work-based
22	education.
23	(1) 1.0; All CTE courses not in an approved program of
24	study

- 2 courses in an approved program of study; or
- 3 (3) 1.48 for a career and technology education level 3
- 4 and 4 courses in an approved program of study.
- 5 (c) A district is entitled to \$50 for each student in
- 6 average daily attendance enrolled in each of the following:
- 7 (1) a campus designated as a P-TECH school under
- 8 Section 29.556; or
- 9 (2) a campus that is a member of the New Tech Network
- 10 and that focuses on project-based learning and work-based
- 11 education.
- 12 (d) In this section:
- 13 (1) "Career and technology education class" and
- 14 "Approved career and technology education program" is a sequence of
- 15 career and technology courses, including technology applications
- 16 courses, authorized by the State Board of Education include
- 17 technology applications courses.
- 18 (2) "Full-time equivalent student" means 30 hours of
- 19 contact a week between a student and career and technology
- 20 education program personnel.
- 21 (3) "Approved career and technology education
- 22 program" in grades 7 and 8, only includes courses that would qualify
- 23 <u>in grades 9-12.</u>
- 24 (4) "Program of study" means a course sequence that
- 25 provides students with the knowledge and skills necessary for
- 26 success in their chosen career and that is approved by the agency
- 27 per the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st

- 1 <u>Century Act (Perkins V).</u>
- 2 (c) (e) At least 55 percent of the funds allocated under
- 3 this section must be used in providing career and technology
- 4 education programs in grades 7 through 12.
- 5 (f) The agency shall identify programs of study and courses
- 6 that qualify for subsections (b)(2) and (3).
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
