4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 1701.165 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1701.165. STUDY ON MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES FOR PEACE
8	OFFICERS. (a) The commission shall study the provision,
9	availability, and accessibility of mental health services for peace
10	officers.
11	(b) In studying the mental health services, the commission
12	<pre>shall collect information from:</pre>
13	(1) law enforcement agencies in this state regarding
14	any mental health programs provided by the agencies, and to the
15	extent available, the use of mental health services by the peace
16	officers of the agencies; and
17	(2) the governor's office regarding the office's
18	implementation of the grant programs under Sections 772.0073 and
19	772.0074, Government Code, and the impact of those programs.
20	(c) Not later than December 1, 2022, the commission shall
21	submit a written report to the legislature with recommendations on:
22	(1) increasing the effectiveness and availability of
23	mental health services for peace officers;

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(2) establishing a mental health program, including a

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- 1 peer mentoring program, within a state agency or political
- 2 subdivision that employs peace officers to improve access to mental
- 3 health services for the peace officers;
- 4 (3) developing sources of funding for programs that
- 5 provide peace officers with access to effective mental health
- 6 services; and
- 7 (4) any other related issue the commission considers
- 8 appropriate.
- 9 <u>(d) This section expires January 1, 2023.</u>
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
