H.B. No. 4310

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to establishing a nutritional support grant program for certain medically fragile children. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 33, Human Resources Code, is amended by adding Subchapter C to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER C. NUTRITIONAL SUPPORT GRANT PROGRAM FOR CERTAIN 7 8 MEDICALLY FRAGILE CHILDREN 9 Sec. 33.101. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: (1) "Grant program" means the nutritional support 10 grant program for medically fragile children established under this 11 12 subchapter. (2) "Medically fragile child" means a person younger 13 14 than 18 years of age who is: (A) chronically ill or disabled and requires 15 16 indefinite skilled nursing care to maintain the person's existence 17 in the person's home; 18 (B) temporarily ill or disabled because of 19 premature birth, accident, or trauma and has experienced a 20 temporary lifestyle change requiring skilled nursing care; 21 (C) suffering from uncontrollable seizures or 22 other chronic illness; or 23 (D) chronically dependent on medical devices to perform vital bodily functions. 24

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H.B. No. 4310 Sec. 33.102. ESTABLISHMENT OF GRANT PROGRAM. The executive 1 commissioner by rule shall develop and implement a grant program to 2 provide financial assistance to the families of medically fragile 3 children who have been diagnosed with a rare or unique disease or 4 5 medical condition for the purpose of assisting families in paying 6 the costs associated with providing specialized nutritional 7 support for that child. 8 Sec. 33.103. ELIGIBILITY. (a) The executive commissioner by rule shall establish eligibility criteria for awarding grants 9 10 under the grant program. The criteria must provide that for a person to be eligible for a grant, the person must: 11 12 (1) be the parent and primary caregiver of a medically fragile child with a rare or unique disease or medical condition 13 14 that requires specialized nutritional support, including enteral 15 nutrition; and 16 (2) lack or have inadequate health benefit plan 17 coverage to pay the costs associated with providing that support. (b) The executive commissioner by rule shall identify the 18 19 diagnoses considered rare and unique for purposes of Subsection (a)(1). 20 21 (c) The executive commissioner may not impose income 22 eligibility requirements under the grant program. Sec. 33.104. AWARD OF GRANTS. (a) The commission may 23 24 approve grants according to commission rules. 25 (b) A grant awarded under this subchapter is governed by 26 Chapter 783, Government Code, and rules adopted under that chapter. Sec. 33.105. FUNDING. The commission shall award grants as 27

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provided by this subchapter from available money and any additional 1 2 money appropriated for this purpose. Sec. 33.106. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The commission 3 4 may accept gifts, grants, and donations from any source that are made for the purposes of the grant program. 5 6 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2022, the executive 7 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement Subchapter C, Chapter 33, Human 8

9 Resources Code, as added by this Act.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
