3	health care services to certain medically fragile children.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 2, Human Resources Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 37 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 37. MEDICALLY FRAGILE CHILDREN ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
8	Sec. 37.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Child health plan program" means the child health
10	plan program established under Chapters 62 and 63, Health and
11	Safety Code.
12	(2) "Medicaid" means the medical assistance program
13	established under Chapter 32.
14	(3) "Medically fragile child" means a person younger
15	than 21 years of age who is:
16	(A) chronically ill or disabled and requires
17	indefinite skilled nursing care to maintain the person's existence
18	in the person's home;
19	(B) temporarily ill or disabled because of
20	premature birth, accident, or trauma and has experienced a
21	temporary lifestyle change requiring skilled nursing care;
22	(C) suffering from uncontrollable seizures or
23	other chronic illness; or
24	(D) chronically dependent on medical devices to

1	perform vital bodily functions.
2	(4) "Program" means the program to provide health care
3	services to medically fragile children established under Section
4	37.002.
5	(5) "Wrap-around benefits" means a service, including
6	a pharmacy or medical benefit:
7	(A) not covered under a private health benefit
8	plan or a public benefit program, including Medicaid and the child
9	health plan program, in which the child is enrolled; or
10	(B) covered under a private health benefit plan
11	in which the child is enrolled but the child has exceeded the
12	private health benefit plan coverage limit.
13	Sec. 37.002. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM. The commission,
14	exclusive of Medicaid, by rule shall develop and implement a
15	program under which health care services are provided to medically
16	fragile children with a rare and unique disease or medical
17	condition. The program must:
18	(1) provide benefits based on a child's diagnosis; and
19	(2) be designed to provide wrap-around benefits to
20	children participating in the program.
21	Sec. 37.003. ELIGIBLE CHILDREN. (a) The executive
22	commissioner by rule shall identify the diagnoses considered rare
23	and unique for purposes of determining eligibility under the
24	program.
25	(b) The executive commissioner may not impose income
26	eligibility requirements under the program.
27	Sec. 37.004. COVERED HEALTH CARE SERVICES. (a) Eligible

No. 4311 health care services under the program must include: 1 2 (1) specialized nutritional support, including 3 enteral nutrition; 4 (2) physical or occupational therapy; 5 (3) <u>speech therapy;</u> (4) music therapy; 6 7 (5) aqua-therapy; 8 (6) hippotherapy; 9 (7) private duty nursing services in home or 10 educational environments; (8) chiropractic services; and 11 12 (9) any other health care service or therapy the commission determines necessary. 13 14 (b) To receive services under the program, the executive 15 commissioner may require that a participant provide evidence: 16 (1) from a health care provider that the proposed services are medically necessary; and 17 18 (2) if the participant has private health benefit plan coverage, that: 19 20 (A) the service is not covered under the plan; 21 (B) the issuer has denied coverage under the 22 plan; or 23 (C) the participant has met the applicable 24 coverage limit under the plan. 25 Sec. 37.005. MEDICALLY FRAGILE CHILDREN ASSISTANCE PROGRAM 26 ACCOUNT. (a) The medically fragile children assistance program account is an account in the general revenue fund. 27

1	(b) The account consists of:
2	(1) appropriations of money to the account by the
3	legislature;
4	(2) gifts, grants, including federal grants, and other
5	donations received under Section 37.006; and
6	(3) interest earned on the investment of money in the
7	account.
8	(c) Money in the account may be appropriated only to the
9	commission for purposes of the program.
10	Sec. 37.006. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The commission
11	may accept gifts, grants, and donations from any source that are
12	made for the purposes of the program. The commission shall deposit
13	money received under this section to the credit of the medically
14	fragile children assistance program account.
15	SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2022, the Health and
16	Human Services Commission shall establish the program to provide
17	health care services to medically fragile children established
18	under Section 37.002, Human Resources Code, as added by this Act.
19	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
