Section 61.601, Education Code, as amended by Chapters 891 (H.B. 3083) and 1101 (H.B. 3808), Acts of the 85th 13 14 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, is reenacted and amended to read as follows: 15 Sec. 61.601. DEFINITION. 16 In this subchapter, "mental health professional" means: 17 18 (1) a licensed physician who is: a graduate of an accredited psychiatric 19 (A) residency training program; or 20 21 (B) certified in psychiatry by: 22 (i) the American Board of Psychiatry and 23 Neurology; or 24 (ii) the American Osteopathic Board of

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1 Neurology and Psychiatry;

2 (2) a psychologist, as defined by Section 501.002,
3 Occupations Code;

4 (3) a licensed professional counselor, as defined by
5 Section 503.002, Occupations Code;

6 (4) an advanced practice registered nurse, as defined
7 by Section <u>301.002</u> [301.152], Occupations Code, who holds a
8 nationally recognized board certification in psychiatric or mental

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1 the practitioner at the practitioner's usual place of business,
2 legibly printed or stamped; and

3 (H) the name, address, and telephone number of 4 the licensed midwife[, registered nurse,] or physician assistant, 5 legibly printed or stamped, if signed by a licensed midwife[, 6 registered nurse,] or physician assistant.

7 SECTION 1.16. Section 483.022(f), Health and Safety Code, 8 is amended to read as follows:

9 (f) A practitioner may designate a person who is a licensed 10 vocational nurse or has an education equivalent to or greater than 11 that required for a licensed vocational nurse to communicate 12 prescriptions of <u>a</u> [an advanced practice nurse or] physician 13 assistant authorized by the practitioner to sign prescription drug 14 orders under Subchapter B, Chapter 157, Occupations Code, or of an 15 advanced practice registered nurse.

Section 32.024(gg), Human Resources Code, is 15 amended to read as follows: (gg) Notwithstanding any other law, including Sections 16 17 843.312 and 1301.052, Insurance Code, the commission shall ensure that advanced practice registered nurses and physician assistants 18 19 may be selected by and assigned to recipients of medical assistance 20 as the primary care providers of those recipients [regardless of whether the physician supervising the advanced practice registered 21 nurse is included in any directory of providers of medical 22 23 assistance maintained by the commission]. This subsection may not 24 be construed as authorizing the commission to supervise or control the practice of medicine as prohibited by Subtitle B, Title 3, 25 26 Occupations Code. 6 (b) A health maintenance organization may refuse a request 7 under Subsection (a) if the physician assistant or advanced 8 practice <u>registered</u> nurse does not meet the quality of care 9 standards previously established by the health maintenance 10 organization for participation in the network by physician 11 assistants and advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurses.

SECTION 1.21. Section 1301.001(1-a), Insurance Code, is amended to read as follows:

14 (1-a) "Health care provider" means a practitioner, 15 institutional provider, or other person or organization that 16 furnishes health care services and that is licensed or otherwise 17 authorized to practice in this state. The term includes a 18 pharmacist, [and] a pharmacy, and an advanced practice registered 19 <u>nurse</u>. The term does not include a physician.

20 SECTION 1.22. Section 1301.052, Insurance Code, is amended 21 to read as follows:

Sec. 1301.052. DESIGNATION OF ADVANCED PRACTICE <u>REGISTERED</u> NURSE OR PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT AS PREFERRED PROVIDER. An insurer offering a preferred provider benefit plan may not refuse a request made by a physician participating as a preferred provider under the plan and an advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurse or physician assistant to have the advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurse or

physician assistant included as a preferred provider under the plan
 if, as applicable:

3 (1) the [advanced practice nurse or] physician 4 assistant is authorized by the physician to provide care under 5 Subchapter B, Chapter 157, Occupations Code; and

6 (2) the advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurse or 7 physician assistant meets the quality of care standards previously 8 established by the insurer for participation in the plan by 9 advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurses and physician assistants.

10 SECTION 1.23. Section 1451.001(2), Insurance Code, is 11 amended to read as follows:

12 (2) "Advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurse" <u>has the</u> 13 <u>meaning assigned by Section 301.002</u>, Occupations Code [means an 14 <u>individual licensed by the Texas Board of Nursing as a registered</u> 15 <u>nurse and recognized by that board as an advanced practice nurse</u>].

SECTION 1.24. Section 1451.104(c), Insurance Code, is amended to read as follows:

(c) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a health insurance 18 19 policy may provide for a different amount of payment or reimbursement for scheduled services or procedures performed by an 20 advanced practice registered nurse, nurse first assistant, 21 licensed surgical assistant, or physician assistant 22 if the 23 methodology used to compute the amount is the same as the methodology used to compute the amount of payment or reimbursement 24 when the services or procedures are provided by a physician. 25

26 SECTION 1.25. Section 1451.106, Insurance Code, is amended 27 to read as follows:

14 (14) "Prescriptive authority agreement" means an 15 agreement entered into by a physician and <u>a</u> [an advanced practice 16 registered nurse or] physician assistant through which the 17 physician delegates to the [advanced practice registered nurse or] 18 physician assistant the act of prescribing or ordering a drug or 19 device.

20 SECTION 1.30. Section 157.0511(b-2), Occupations Code, is 21 amended to read as follows:

(b-2) The board shall adopt rules that require a physician who delegates the prescribing or ordering of a drug or device to register with the board the name and license number of the physician assistant [or advanced practice registered nurse] to whom a delegation is made. The board may develop and use an electronic online delegation registration process for registration under this

1 subsection.

2 SECTION 1.31. Sections 157.0512(a), (b), (c), (e), (f), 3 (g), (i), (j), (l), (m), (n), and (o), Occupations Code, are amended 4 to read as follows:

(c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), the [combined] number of [advanced practice registered nurses and] physician assistants with whom a physician may enter into a prescriptive authority agreement may not exceed seven [advanced practice registered nurses and] physician assistants or the full-time equivalent of seven [advanced practice registered nurses and] physician assistants.

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(e) A prescriptive authority agreement must, at a minimum:

15 (1) be in writing and signed and dated by the parties16 to the agreement;

17 (2) state the name, address, and all professional18 license numbers of the parties to the agreement;

19 (3) state the nature of the practice, practice20 locations, or practice settings;

(4) identify the types or categories of drugs or devices that may be prescribed or the types or categories of drugs or devices that may not be prescribed;

(5) provide a general plan for addressing consultationand referral;

27 (7) state the general process for communication and

1 the sharing of information between the physician and the [advanced 2 practice registered nurse or] physician assistant to whom the 3 physician has delegated prescriptive authority related to the care 4 and treatment of patients;

7 (A) provide appropriate supervision on a
