A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the universal service fund. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 151.801, Tax Code, is amended by 4 5 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d-1) to read as follows: 6 (a) Except for the amounts allocated under Subsections (b), 7 (c), (c-2), [and] (c-3), and (d-1), all proceeds from the 8 9 collection of the taxes imposed by this chapter shall be deposited to the credit of the general revenue fund. 10 11 (d-1) The first \$200 million of the proceeds received in a 12 state fiscal year from the collection of the taxes imposed by this chapter on telecommunications services shall be deposited to the 13 14 credit of the universal service fund sales tax receipts account in the general revenue fund. The comptroller shall determine the 15 16 amount to be deposited under this subsection according to available statistical data indicating the estimated or actual total proceeds 17 in this state from taxes imposed on the sale of telecommunications 18 19 services. SECTION 2. Section 51.002, Utilities Code, is amended to 20 21 read as follows: Sec. 51.002. DEFINITIONS. In this subtitle: 22 23 (1) "Basic local telecommunications service" means: (A) flat rate residential and business local 24

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1 exchange telephone service, including primary directory listings; 2 tone dialing service; (B) 3 (C) [access to operator services] access to 4 facilities with data transmission capability; 5 (D) access to directory assistance services and 6 operator services; 7 (E) access to 911 service provided by a local 8 authority or dual party relay service; the ability to report service problems seven 9 (F) 10 days a week; lifeline and tel-assistance services; and 11 (G) 12 (H) any other service the commission determines after a hearing is a basic local telecommunications service. 13 14 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 56, Utilities Code, is 15 amended by adding Sections 56.003 and 56.004 to read as follows: Sec. 56.003. COMPTROLLER. A reference in this chapter to 16 17 the commission means the comptroller. Sec. 56.004. PROHIBITION AGAINST CROSS-SUBSIDIZATION (a) A 18 19 company that the commission determines willfully and knowingly uses support received under this chapter to subsidize an activity of the 20 company that is not subject to rate regulation under this subtitle 21 will be subject to a fine by the commission of up to \$100,000. The 22 commission may, by rule, determine a procedure for terminating the 23 certification of a company that is found to have an ongoing pattern 24 25 of such subsidization. 26 SECTION 4. Section 56.021, Utilities Code, is amended to

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read as follows:

1 Sec. 56.021. UNIVERSAL SERVICE FUND ESTABLISHED; SALES TAX RECEIPTS ACCOUNT. (a) The commission shall adopt and enforce rules 2 3 requiring local exchange companies to establish a universal service fund to: 4 5 (1) assist telecommunications providers in providing basic local telecommunications service at reasonable rates in high 6 cost rural areas under two plans: 7 8 (A) the Texas High Cost Universal Service Plan 9 (16 T.A.C. Section 26.403); and 10 (B) the Small and Rural Incumbent Local Exchange Company Universal Service Plan (16 T.A.C. Section 26.404); 11 12 (2) reimburse the telecommunications carrier that provides the statewide telecommunications relay access service 13 14 under Subchapter D; 15 (3) finance the specialized telecommunications assistance program established under Subchapter E; 16 17 (4) reimburse the department and the commission for costs incurred in implementing this chapter and Chapter 57; 18 19 (5) reimburse a telecommunications carrier providing lifeline service as provided by 47 C.F.R. Part 54, Subpart E, as 20 21 amended; finance the implementation and administration of 22 (6) 23 the identification under Section 17.007 for process 24 telecommunications services; 25 (7) reimburse a designated provider under Subchapter 26 F; 27 (8) reimburse a successor utility under Subchapter G;

1 and

2 (9) finance the program established under Subchapter3 H.

4 (b) The universal service fund sales tax receipts account is 5 an account in the general revenue fund administered by the 6 commission. The account consists of revenue deposited to the 7 account under Section 151.801(d-1), Tax Code. Money in the account 8 is available to be appropriated for the purposes of this chapter.

9 SECTION 5. Subchapter B, Chapter 56, Utilities Code, is 10 amended by adding Sections 56.034 and 56.035 to read as follows:

Sec. 56.034. SUPPORT ALLOCATION. Notwithstanding another provision of this chapter, the commission shall subdivide each exchange that serves both urban and rural areas and may require that support distributed under this chapter be used only for a rural portion of a subdivided exchange.

16 <u>Sec. 56.035. TRANSITION. (a) The commission shall create</u>
17 <u>and publish a plan to:</u>

18 (1) over a 5-year period, gradually reduce the amount 19 of distributions made from the fund for programs other than the 20 programs described by Section 56.021(1);

(b) The plan must include recommendations for statutory
 changes necessary to authorize the commission to execute the plan.

23 SECTION 6. (a) In this section, "commission" means the 24 Public Utility Commission of Texas.

25 (b) On September 1, 2021:

26 (1) all functions and activities related to the 27 universal service fund established under Chapter 56, Utilities

H.B. No. 4373 1 Code, performed by the commission immediately before that date are 2 transferred to the comptroller;

3 (2) all rules, fees, policies, procedures, decisions,
4 and forms related to the universal service fund adopted by the
5 commission are continued in effect as rules, fees, policies,
6 procedures, decisions, and forms of the comptroller, as applicable,
7 and remain in effect until amended or replaced by the comptroller;

8 (3) a complaint, investigation, contested case, or 9 other proceeding related to the universal service fund before the 10 commission that is pending on September 1, 2021, is transferred 11 without change in status to the comptroller;

12 (4) all money, contracts, leases, property, and 13 obligations related to the universal service fund are transferred 14 to the comptroller;

15 (5) all property related to the universal service fund 16 in the custody of the commission is transferred to the comptroller; 17 and

18 (6) the unexpended and unobligated balance of any 19 money appropriated by the legislature for the commission for the 20 purpose of administering the universal service fund is transferred 21 to the comptroller.

(c) The commission shall provide the comptroller with access to any systems or information necessary for the comptroller to administer the universal service fund.

(d) On September 1, 2021, all full-time equivalent employee positions at the commission that primarily concern the administration or enforcement of the universal service fund become

1 positions at the office of the comptroller.

2 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
