## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to provision of an opioid antagonist to a person who is
- 3 filling a prescription for an opioid medication.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 483.103, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Subsection (b-1) and amending Subsection (c) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (b-1) A pharmacist may dispense an opioid antagonist
- 9 without a prescription to a person to whom the pharmacist is
- 10 dispensing an opioid medication under a prescription if:
- 11 (1) the opioid is prescribed in conjunction with
- 12 benzodiazepine medication;
- 13 (2) the prescription of the dispensed medication
- 14 directs the patient to take 90 morphine milligram equivalents or
- 15 more daily;
- 16 (3) in the pharmacist's professional opinion, the
- 17 patient is at risk of accidental overdose or potential abuse or
- 18 <u>overuse; or</u>
- 19 <u>(4) the physician who issued the prescription has</u>
- 20 communicated to the pharmacist that in the physician's professional
- 21 opinion, the patient is at risk of accidental overdose or potential
- 22 abuse or overuse.
- 23 (c) A pharmacist who, acting in good faith and with
- 24 reasonable care, dispenses or does not dispense an opioid

- 1 antagonist under a valid prescription or on the pharmacist's own
- 2 <u>initiative under Subsection (b-1)</u> is not subject to any criminal or
- 3 civil liability or any professional disciplinary action for:
- 4 (1) dispensing or failing to dispense the opioid
- 5 antagonist; or
- 6 (2) if the pharmacist chooses to dispense an opioid
- 7 antagonist, any outcome resulting from the eventual administration
- 8 of the opioid antagonist.
- 9 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 10 to a person to whom the pharmacist dispenses an opioid medication
- 11 under a prescription on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
