- 5 SECTION 1. Section 43.05 is amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 43.05. COMPELLING PROSTITUTION CHILD SEXUAL
- 7 EXPLOITATION.
- 8 (a) In this Section:
- 9 (1) "Sexual performance by a child" has the same
- 10 meaning assigned in Section 43.25
- 11 (b) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly:
- 12 (1) causes another by force, threat, coercion, or
- 13 fraud to commit prostitution participate in sexual performance by a
- 14 child; or
- 15 (2) causes by any means a child younger than 18 years
- 16 to commit prostitution participate in sexual performance by a
- 17 child, regardless of whether the actor knows the age of the child at
- 18 the time of the offense.
- 19 (c) An offense under this section is a felony of the first
- 20 degree.
- 21 (d) If conduct constituting an offense under this section
- 22 also constitutes an offense under another section of this code, the
- 23 actor may be prosecuted under either section or under both
- 24 sections.

- 1 (d) For purposes of this section, "coercion" as defined by
- 2 Section 1.07 includes:
- 3 (1) destroying, concealing, confiscating, or
- 4 withholding from a person, or threatening to destroy, conceal,
- 5 confiscate, or withhold from a person, the person's actual or
- 6 purported:
- 7 (A) government records; or
- 8 (B) identifying information or documents;
- 9 (2) causing a person, without the person's consent, to
- 10 become intoxicated, as defined by Section 49.01, to a degree that
- 11 impairs the person's ability to appraise the nature of the person's
- 12 conduct that constitutes prostitution sexual performance by a
- 13 child; or to resist engaging in that conduct; or
- 14 (3) withholding alcohol or a controlled substance to a
- 15 degree that impairs the ability of a person with a chemical
- 16 dependency, as defined by Section 462.001, Health and Safety Code,
- 17 to appraise the nature of the person's conduct that constitutes
- 18 prostitution sexual performance by a child or to resist engaging in
- 19 that conduct.
