A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to a program to provide certain children with character
3	development opportunities, career advancement assistance, and
4	access to certain extracurricular and wellness services.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle I, Title 4, Government Code, is amended
7	by adding Chapter 543 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 543. OPPORTUNITY AND ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR CERTAIN
9	CHILDREN
10	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
11	Sec. 543.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
12	(1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
13	Commission.
14	(2) "Eligible child" means:
15	(A) a child receiving educational services under
16	the supervision of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department;
17	(B) a child in the managing conservatorship of
18	the Department of Family and Protective Services;
19	(C) a child who is eligible to participate in the
20	Head Start program as defined by Chapter 72, Human Resources Code;
21	(D) a student described by Section 29.916(a)(1),
22	Education Code;
23	(E) a child with an intellectual disability; and
24	(F) any other child to whom the executive

- 1 commissioner is able to extend program access after prioritizing
- 2 access for children described by Paragraphs (A)-(E).
- 3 (3) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
- 4 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
- 5 (4) "Program" means the opportunity and assistance
- 6 program established under this chapter.
- 7 Sec. 543.002. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The commission
- 8 may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and donations from any public
- 9 or private source for the purposes of this chapter.
- 10 Sec. 543.003. REPORT TO GOVERNOR AND LEGISLATURE. Not
- 11 later than December 1 of each even-numbered year, the commission
- 12 shall submit a report to the governor and members of the legislature
- 13 regarding the program and activities of program participants.
- 14 Sec. 543.004. RULES. The executive commissioner may adopt
- 15 rules necessary to implement this chapter.
- SUBCHAPTER B. PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION, OPPORTUNITIES, AND
- 17 ASSISTANCE
- 18 Sec. 543.051. PROGRAM ESTABLISHMENT. The executive
- 19 commissioner by rule shall establish and administer the opportunity
- 20 and assistance program to provide character development
- 21 opportunities, career advancement assistance, access to University
- 22 Interscholastic League sponsored activities, and counseling and
- 23 wellness services to eligible children.
- Sec. 543.052. ADMINISTRATION OF PROGRAM. (a) The
- 25 executive commissioner shall:
- 26 (1) adopt rules as necessary to administer the
- 27 program; and

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1	(2) work collaboratively with school districts, the
2	University Interscholastic League, and other local authorities as
3	necessary to fulfill the commission's duties under this chapter.
4	(b) In developing the program, the executive commissioner
5	may partner with online and local providers to offer program
6	participants the character development opportunities and career
7	advancement assistance described by Sections 543.053 and 543.054.
8	Sec. 543.053. CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES. The
9	program must include character development opportunities designed
10	to promote and assist program participants in developing the
11	<pre>character qualities of:</pre>
12	(1) courage;
13	(2) trustworthiness, including honesty, reliability,
14	<pre>punctuality, and loyalty;</pre>
15	<pre>(3) integrity;</pre>
16	(4) respect and courtesy;
17	(5) responsibility, including accountability,
18	diligence, perseverance, and self-control;
19	(6) fairness, including justice and freedom from
20	<pre>prejudice;</pre>
21	(7) caring, including kindness, empathy, compassion,
22	consideration, patience, generosity, and charity;
23	(8) good citizenship, including patriotism, concern
24	for the common good and the community, and respect for authority and
25	the law;
26	(9) gratitude; and
27	(10) teamwork, good sportsmanship, and perseverance

- 1 learned through participation in competitive or professional
- 2 extracurricular activities.
- 3 Sec. 543.054. CAREER ADVANCEMENT ASSISTANCE. The program
- 4 must include opportunities designed to assist program participants
- 5 in general career advancement. The opportunities must include:
- 6 (1) training and information on where program
- 7 participants can obtain affordable and local access to career and
- 8 technical skills courses; and
- 9 (2) instruction or access to instruction on general
- 10 skills including:
- 11 (A) constructing a resume;
- 12 (B) interviewing for a job;
- 13 (C) managing finances;
- 14 (D) constructing and following a realistic and
- 15 consistent schedule;
- (E) managing finances, work, family, and mental
- 17 health in times of personal, community, or global crisis;
- 18 (F) finding and obtaining higher education
- 19 financial aid opportunities; and
- 20 (G) skills learned through participation in
- 21 competitive extracurricular activities that could be used as a
- 22 career path for the program participant or could be used to obtain
- 23 higher education financial aid opportunities for the program
- 24 participant.
- Sec. 543.055. ACCESS TO UNIVERSITY INTERSCHOLASTIC LEAGUE
- 26 ACTIVITIES. (a) In order to maximize access to character
- 27 development opportunities and career advancement assistance

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- 1 described by Sections 543.053 and 543.054, the executive
- 2 commissioner, in collaboration with school districts and the
- 3 University Interscholastic League, shall facilitate access to
- 4 University Interscholastic League activities for all program
- 5 participants described by Sections 543.001(2)(A)-(E) and for as
- 6 many program participants described by Section 543.001(2)(F) as can
- 7 reasonably be accommodated. A school district and the University
- 8 Interscholastic League may not prohibit a program participant who
- 9 is otherwise eligible to participate in a league activity from
- 10 participating in the activity in substantially the same manner as a
- 11 student enrolled at a school in the school district.
- 12 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (g), a public school
- 13 that participates in an activity sponsored by the University
- 14 Interscholastic League shall provide a program participant
- 15 <u>described</u> by Section 543.001(2)(D) who otherwise meets league
- 16 eligibility standards to represent that school in a league activity
- 17 with the opportunity to participate in the activity on behalf of the
- 18 school in the same manner that the school provides the opportunity
- 19 to participate to students enrolled in the school.
- 20 (c) A program participant described by Section
- 21 543.001(2)(D) who seeks to participate or participates in a league
- 22 activity on behalf of a school is subject to the policies regarding
- 23 registration, age eligibility, fees, insurance, transportation,
- 24 physical condition, qualifications, responsibilities, event
- 25 schedules, standards of behavior, and performance that apply to
- 26 students enrolled in the school.
- 27 (d) The parent or person standing in parental relation to a

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- program participant described by Section 543.001(2)(D) is 1 responsible for oversight of academic standards relating to the 2 participant's participation in a league activity. As a condition 3 of eligibility to participate in a league activity during the first 4 six weeks of a school year, a program participant described by 5 Section 543.001(2)(D) must demonstrate grade-level academic 6 7 proficiency on any nationally recognized, norm-referenced assessment instrument, such as the Iowa Test of Basic Skills, 8 Stanford Achievement Test, California Achievement Test, or 9 Comprehensive Test of Basic Skills. The program participant 10 demonstrates the required academic proficiency by achieving a 11 12 composite, core, or survey score that is within the average or higher than average range of scores, as established by the 13 applicable testing service. For purposes of this subsection, a 14 school district shall accept assessment results administered or 15 16 reported by a third party.
- (e) The demonstration of academic proficiency under

 Subsection (d) of a program participant described by Section

 543.001(2)(D) is sufficient for purposes of that subsection for the

 school year in which the participant achieves the required score

 and the subsequent school year.
- 22 (f) After the first six weeks of a school year, the parent or
 23 person standing in parental relation to a program participant
 24 described by Section 543.001(2)(D) participating in a league
 25 activity on behalf of a public school must periodically, in
 26 accordance with the school's grading calendar, provide written
 27 verification to the school indicating that the participant is

- 1 receiving a passing grade in each course or subject being taught.
- 2 (g) A program participant described by Section
- 3 543.001(2)(D) is not authorized by this section to participate in a
- 4 league activity during the remainder of any school year during
- 5 which the participant was previously enrolled in a public school.
- 6 (h) The University Interscholastic League may not prohibit
- 7 a program participant described by Section 543.001(2)(D) from
- 8 participating in league activities in the manner authorized by this
- 9 section.
- 10 (i) With respect to the education program of a program
- 11 participant described by Section 543.001(2)(D), nothing in this
- 12 section shall be construed to permit an agency of this state, a
- 13 public school district, or any other governmental body to exercise
- 14 control, regulatory authority, or supervision over the participant
- 15 or a parent or person standing in parental relation to the
- 16 participant beyond the control, regulatory authority, or
- 17 supervision required to participate in a league activity.
- 18 (j) Subject only to eligibility requirements under this
- 19 section for a program participant described by Section
- 20 543.001(2)(D) to participate in a league activity:
- 21 (1) the curriculum or assessment requirements,
- 22 performance standards, practices, or creed of the education program
- 23 provided to a program participant described by Section
- 24 543.001(2)(D) may not be required to be changed in order for the
- 25 participant to participate in a league activity; and
- 26 (2) for a program participant described by Section
- 27 543.001(2)(D) participating in an education program on January 1,

- 1 2021, the education program provided to that participant may not be
- 2 required to comply with any state law or agency rule relating to
- 3 that education program unless the law or rule was in effect on
- 4 <u>January 1</u>, 2021.
- 5 Sec. 543.056. COUNSELING AND WELLNESS SERVICES. (a) The
- 6 executive commissioner shall develop partnerships with local and
- 7 online health care providers and counseling services providers to
- 8 provide voluntary counseling and health services to program
- 9 participants who are not otherwise eligible for those services
- 10 under Medicaid or the child health plan program.
- 11 (b) The services described by Subsection (a) must include:
- 12 (1) voluntary testing services made available to a
- 13 program participant's parent or managing conservator to screen the
- 14 participant for infection from common childhood diseases;
- 15 (2) general counseling services designed to help a
- 16 program participant process emotions brought on by unexpected and
- 17 destabilizing changes in the participant's family and community;
- 18 (3) services for the prevention and treatment of
- 19 intellectual disabilities; and
- 20 <u>(4) services to treat physical injuries c</u>aused by
- 21 participation in organized extracurricular sports through the
- 22 University Interscholastic League.
- 23 SECTION 2. The executive commissioner of the Health and
- 24 Human Services Commission shall adopt the rules necessary to
- 25 establish the program under Chapter 543, Government Code, as added
- 26 by this Act, beginning in the 2021-2022 school year.
- 27 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
