4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Article 11.31(k), Tax Code, is amended by adding
6	subsection (19) to read as follows:
7	(k) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality shall
8	adopt rules establishing a nonexclusive list of facilities,
9	devices, or methods for the control of air, water, or land
10	pollution, which must include:
11	(1) coal cleaning or refining facilities;
12	(2) atmospheric or pressurized and bubbling or
13	circulating fluidized bed combustion systems and gasification
14	fluidized bed combustion combined cycle systems;
15	(3) ultra-supercritical pulverized coal boilers;
16	(4) flue gas recirculation components;
17	(5) syngas purification systems and gas-cleanup
18	units;
19	(6) enhanced heat recovery systems;
20	(7) exhaust heat recovery boilers;
21	(8) heat recovery steam generators;
22	(9) superheaters and evaporators;
23	(10) enhanced steam turbine systems;
24	(11) methanation:

- 1 (12) coal combustion or gasification byproduct and
- 2 coproduct handling, storage, or treatment facilities;
- 3 (13) biomass cofiring storage, distribution, and
- 4 firing systems;
- 5 (14) coal cleaning or drying processes, such as coal
- 6 drying/moisture reduction, air jigging, precombustion
- 7 decarbonization, and coal flow balancing technology;
- 8 (15) oxy-fuel combustion technology, amine or chilled
- 9 ammonia scrubbing, fuel or emission conversion through the use of
- 10 catalysts, enhanced scrubbing technology, modified combustion
- 11 technology such as chemical looping, and cryogenic technology;
- 12 (16) if the United States Environmental Protection
- 13 Agency adopts a final rule or regulation regulating carbon dioxide
- 14 as a pollutant, property that is used, constructed, acquired, or
- 15 installed wholly or partly to capture carbon dioxide from an
- 16 anthropogenic source in this state that is geologically sequestered
- 17 in this state;
- 18 (17) fuel cells generating electricity using hydrogen
- 19 derived from coal, biomass, petroleum coke, or solid waste; [and]
- 20 (18) any other equipment designed to prevent, capture,
- 21 abate, or monitor nitrogen oxides, volatile organic compounds,
- 22 particulate matter, mercury, carbon monoxide, or any criteria
- 23 pollutant; and [-]
- 24 (19) land-based approaches to carbon sequestration,
- 25 <u>including but not limited to reforestation, afforestation, forest</u>
- 26 conservation, restorative grazing practices, conservation tillage
- 27 and no-till land preparation methods, use of cover crops, switch

- 1 grass and other native grasses, and other forms of conservation
- 2 <u>agriculture with evidence-based carbon sequestration benefits.</u>
