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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to certain complaints against and training for peace 3 officers. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter B, Chapter 614, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER B. COMPLAINT AGAINST CERTAIN LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS 7 [OFFICER] OR FIRE FIGHTERS [FIGHTER] 8 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 614, Government Code, is amended by adding Subchapter B-1 to read as follows: 10 11 SUBCHAPTER B-1. COMPLAINTS AGAINST PEACE OFFICERS 12 Sec. 614.031. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "law enforcement agency" means an agency of this state or an agency of a 13 14 political subdivision of this state authorized by law to employ peace officers. 15 16 Sec. 614.032. RETENTION OF COMPLAINTS. Notwithstanding any other law, a law enforcement agency shall retain a copy of each 17 written complaint filed against a peace officer until at least the 18 fifth anniversary of the date of the officer's separation from 19 20 employment with the agency. 21 Sec. 614.033. REPORTING OF CERTAIN COMPLAINTS TO TEXAS COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT. The head of a law enforcement agency 22 23 shall report each written complaint filed against a peace officer that alleges the officer engaged in racial profiling or racially 24

2	Enforcement not later than the 15th day after the date the complaint
3	is filed.
4	SECTION 3. Subchapter F, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 1701.269 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 1701.269. RACIAL PROFILING AND CULTURAL DIVERSITY
7	TRAINING PROGRAM. (a) The commission shall establish a training
8	program on racial profiling and cultural diversity. The program
9	must consist of not less than 48 hours of classroom instruction,
10	designed to be completed in increments in accordance with
11	Subsection (c).
12	(b) The commission shall maintain a record of the number of
13	complaints regarding a peace officer that have been reported to the
14	commission under Section 614.033, Government Code, in a 12-month
15	period.
16	(c) The commission shall require a peace officer with
17	respect to whom 10 or more complaints have been reported in a
18	12-month period to complete the applicable number of hours of
19	training as follows:
20	(1) for an officer who has 10 or more but fewer than 20
21	complaints, 16 hours;
22	(2) for an officer who has 20 or more but fewer than 30
23	complaints, the number of hours required under Subdivision (1) plus
24	an additional 16 hours; and
25	(3) for an officer who has 30 or more complaints, the
26	number of hours required under Subdivision (2) plus an additional
27	16 hours.

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SECTION 4. Section 1701.451, Occupations Code, is amended
by adding Subsections (d), (e), and (f) to read as follows:

3 (d) A law enforcement agency that makes a person's 4 employment records available under Subsection (a-1) to another law 5 enforcement agency shall provide a copy of the records to the 6 person.

7 <u>(e) A hiring law enforcement agency that reviews a person's</u> 8 employment records from another law enforcement agency under this 9 section must, before the hiring agency makes a determination 10 regarding the person's employment, provide the person an 11 opportunity to comment on the content of the records in the manner 12 prescribed by the hiring agency.

13 (f) A complaint required to be retained under Section 14 614.032, Government Code, is an employment record for purposes of 15 this section.

16 SECTION 5. Not later than January 1, 2022, the Texas 17 Commission on Law Enforcement shall establish the training program 18 required by Section 1701.269, Occupations Code, as added by this 19 Act.

SECTION 6. Subchapter B-1, Chapter 614, Government Code, as added by this Act, applies only to a complaint filed with a law enforcement agency on or after January 1, 2022. A complaint filed before January 1, 2022, is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

26 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
