H.B. No. 4487

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to measures to facilitate the successful completion of degree and certificate programs by certain adult learners at public institutions of higher education.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding Subchapter R to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER R. TEXAS RECOVERY ACT

Sec. 61.801. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:

(1) "Adult learner" means a person who:

(A) is at least 25 years of age but not older than 34 years of age; and

(B) within the preceding 48 months, has achieved at least 75 percent completion of a baccalaureate or associate degree or certificate program.

(2) "Texas WORKS internship program" means the Texas Working Off-Campus: Reinforcing Knowledge and Skills (WORKS) Internship Program established under Subchapter E-1, Chapter 56.

Sec. 61.802. TUITION ASSISTANCE GRANT FOR ADULT LEARNERS.

(a) For the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 academic years, the board shall provide to each adult learner enrolled in a baccalaureate or associate degree or certificate program at an institution of higher education a grant for each semester or term in the amount equal to 25 percent of the average statewide amount of tuition and required

1 fees that a resident student enrolled full-time in a baccalaureate  
2 or associate degree or certificate program, as applicable, would be  
3 charged for that semester or term at the type of institution of  
4 higher education at which the adult learner is enrolled.

5 (b) An adult learner receiving a grant under this section  
6 may use the money only to pay the cost of tuition or required fees  
7 for the baccalaureate or associate degree or certificate program in  
8 which the adult learner is enrolled at an institution of higher  
9 education.

10 Sec. 61.803. INCENTIVE FUNDING FOR ADULT LEARNERS. (a) For  
11 the state fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2023, the board  
12 shall distribute incentive funding to each institution of higher  
13 education based on the number of adult learners enrolled at the  
14 institution who, during the preceding state fiscal biennium:

15 (1) timely completed:

16 (A) a baccalaureate or associate degree program  
17 in accordance with the adult learner's degree plan; or

18 (B) a certificate program, as established by  
19 board rule; or

20 (2) received a baccalaureate or associate degree or  
21 certificate in a target field, as established by board rule.

22 (b) Subject to the availability of funds, the amount of  
23 incentive funding distributed per qualifying adult learner to an  
24 institution of higher education under this section for a state  
25 fiscal biennium may not be less than the amount of funding provided  
26 per student for that biennium for achievement of an equivalent  
27 student success measure under Section 61.0593(f), Education Code.

1        Sec. 61.804. FINAL SEMESTER INTERNSHIPS FOR ADULT LEARNERS.

2        (a) For the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 academic years, the board shall  
3        collaborate with employers who participate in the Texas WORKS  
4        internship program to ensure that:

5                (1) employers give priority in employment under that  
6        program to adult learners in the final semester of a baccalaureate  
7        or associate degree or certificate program at an institution of  
8        higher education; and

9                (2) each adult learner employed through that program  
10       during the adult learner's final semester of a baccalaureate or  
11       associate degree or certificate program at an institution of higher  
12       education receives an additional \$2,500 stipend as part of the  
13       adult learner's wages under that program.

14        (b) The board shall certify internships provided through  
15       the Texas WORKS internship program through which an adult learner  
16       may earn course credit toward the adult learner's baccalaureate or  
17       associate degree or certificate program, as applicable.

18        Sec. 61.805. GRAD TX PROGRAM. The board shall establish the  
19       Grad TX program in collaboration with institutions of higher  
20       education to support the reskilling, upskilling, and high-value  
21       degree or certificate program completion of adult learners. The  
22       program may include:

23                (1) academic and career advising;

24                (2) assistance with available student financial aid  
25       options; and

26                (3) flexible degree or certificate programs designed  
27       for adult learners.

1       Sec. 61.806. LIMITATION. (a) The total amount spent under  
2 this subchapter may not exceed \$50 million.

3       (b) If the total cost of providing grants, incentive  
4 funding, or stipends to all eligible adult learners or institutions  
5 of higher education under this subchapter would exceed the amount  
6 that may be spent under Subsection (a), the board shall reduce the  
7 amount of each grant, incentive funding award, and stipend as  
8 necessary to comply with that subsection.

9       Sec. 61.807. FEDERAL FUNDING. (a) The board may only use  
10 federal funding available for purposes of job training and  
11 reskilling, to the extent authorized by federal law, to implement  
12 this subchapter.

13       (b) The board may accept federal grants for purposes of this  
14 subchapter.

15       Sec. 61.808. REPORT. Not later than December 1 of each  
16 year, the board shall submit to the governor, the lieutenant  
17 governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives a report  
18 on the status and effectiveness of the measures established under  
19 this subchapter.

20       Sec. 61.809. RULES. The board may adopt rules as necessary  
21 to implement this subchapter. In adopting rules, the board shall  
22 consult with institutions of higher education, the Texas Workforce  
23 Commission, members of the business community, and other relevant  
24 stakeholders.

25       Sec. 61.810. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires September  
26 1, 2025.

27       SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2022, the Texas Higher

1 Education Coordinating Board shall submit the board's initial  
2 report required under Section 61.808, Education Code, as added by  
3 this Act.

4 SECTION 3. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board is  
5 required to implement a provision of this Act only if the  
6 legislature appropriates money specifically for that purpose. If  
7 the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that  
8 purpose, the coordinating board may, but is not required to,  
9 implement a provision of this Act using other appropriations  
10 available for that purpose.

11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
15 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
