A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a restriction on permits authorizing direct discharges
3	of waste or pollutants into water in certain areas associated with
4	the Barton Springs segment of the Edwards Aquifer.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 26, Water Code, is amended
7	by adding Section 26.0462 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 26.0462. RESTRICTIONS ON PERMITS FOR DIRECT DISCHARGES
9	OF WASTE OR POLLUTANTS INTO WATER IN CERTAIN ZONES OF BARTON SPRINGS
10	SEGMENT OF EDWARDS AQUIFER. (a) In this section:
11	(1) "Advanced water treatment facility" means a
12	facility that uses water and wastewater treatment technology that:
13	(A) meets the primary and secondary drinking
14	water standards promulgated by the commission;
15	(B) does not contribute to adverse toxic effects
16	on:
17	(i) aquatic life in the receiving water; or
18	(ii) human health resulting from the
19	consumption of aquatic organisms or water from, or from water
20	recreation in, the receiving water; and
21	(C) achieves a daily average concentration of:
22	(i) total phosphorus in the effluent of
23	less than 0.2 milligrams per liter; and
24	(ii) total nitrogen in the effluent of less

- 1 than 8 milligrams per liter.
- 2 (2) "Edwards Aquifer water quality protection area"
- 3 means:
- 4 (A) the Nueces, San Antonio, and Guadalupe River
- 5 watersheds located north and west of the Edwards Aquifer recharge
- 6 zone; and
- 7 (B) the portion of the Colorado River watershed
- 8 located in Blanco, Hays, and Travis Counties that drains to the
- 9 Edwards Aquifer recharge zone southwest of the Colorado River.
- 10 (b) The commission may not:
- 11 (1) issue a new permit authorizing the direct
- 12 discharge of waste or pollutants into any water in the Edwards
- 13 Aquifer water quality protection area; or
- 14 (2) amend a permit issued before September 1, 2021, to
- 15 <u>authorize</u> an increase in the amount of waste or pollutants that may
- 16 be directly discharged into the Edwards Aquifer water quality
- 17 protection area.
- 18 (c) The commission shall adopt standards necessary to
- 19 require permit holders maintain wastewater storage capacity for a
- 20 minimum of 7 days.
- 21 (d) This section does not:
- 22 <u>(1) affect the authority</u> of the commission to
- 23 <u>authorize:</u>
- 24 (A) the direct discharge of water into the
- 25 Edwards Aquifer water quality protection area from an advanced
- 26 water treatment facility under a Texas pollutant discharge
- 27 elimination system permit if all requirements for the discharge

- 1 permit are satisfied; or
- 2 (B) stormwater and certain non-stormwater
- 3 discharges as specified in:
- 4 <u>(i)</u> the commission's individual permits for
- 5 municipal separate storm sewer systems; and
- 6 <u>(ii)</u> the commission's general permits for
- 7 stormwater and associated non-stormwater discharges; or
- 8 (2) apply to on-site sewage disposal systems.
- 9 <u>(e) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent</u>
- 10 the commission from setting permit limits more stringent than those
- 11 <u>set forth above for advanced water treatment facilities.</u>
- 12 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 13 to an application for a permit or permit amendment that is submitted
- 14 to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality on or after the
- 15 effective date of this Act. An application for a permit or permit
- 16 amendment that was submitted to the Texas Commission on
- 17 Environmental Quality before the effective date of this Act is
- 18 governed by the law in effect at the time the application was filed,
- 19 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. set
- 20 forth above for an advanced water treatment facility.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
