A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to compliance with the National Voter Registration Act.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 13, Election Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 13.009 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 13.009. VOTER REGISTRATION IN A SIMULTANEOUS
7	TRANSACTION FOR DRIVER'S LICENSE RENEWALS BY PERSONS ELIGIBLE. (a)
8	The secretary of state and the Department of Public Safety shall
9	jointly implement a program to allow a person who is a citizen of
10	the United States and has an unexpired driver's license issued in
11	this state to complete a voter registration application
12	simultaneously with the person's application for an original,
13	renewal, or duplicate driver's license and from the official
14	Internet website of this state. The Internet websites of the
15	secretary of state and the Department of Public Safety must also
16	provide a link to the location of the application on the official
17	Internet website of this state.
18	(b) An applicant for electronic voter registration must:
19	(1) attest to the truth of the information provided on
20	the application by affirmatively accepting the information as true;
21	(2) affirmatively consent to the use of the signature
22	on the applicant's driver's license or personal identification card
23	for voter registration purposes;
24	(3) provide the information required under Section

- 1 13.002(c); and
- 2 (4) provide the audit number and date of issuance of
- 3 the applicant's Texas driver's license issued by the Department of
- 4 Public Safety.
- 5 (c) For each application the program shall:
- 6 (1) require that a digital copy of the applicant's
- 7 signature be obtained from the Department of Public Safety; and
- 8 (2) compare the information provided by the applicant
- 9 against Department of Public Safety records.
- 10 (d) If the information submitted by an applicant does not
- 11 match Department of Public Safety records, the program shall:
- 12 (1) notify the applicant that the application is
- 13 incomplete; and
- 14 (2) advise the applicant to correct and resubmit the
- 15 application.
- 16 (e) If the information submitted by an applicant matches
- 17 Department of Public Safety records, the program shall forward the
- 18 application to the registrar of the county in which the applicant
- 19 states that the applicant resides and to the secretary of state.
- 20 (f) An application electronically submitted under this
- 21 section is considered for all purposes as an application submitted
- 22 by mail under this title.
- 23 (g) The secretary of state shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 24 implement this section, including rules to provide for additional
- 25 security measures necessary to ensure the accuracy and integrity of
- 26 applications submitted electronically.
- 27 (h) The rules adopted under Subsection (g) must require

- 1 <u>that:</u>
- 2 (1) the Internet website through which a person may
- 3 <u>complete a voter registration application</u> include a description of
- 4 the offense described by Section 13.007 in a conspicuous location
- 5 on the website near the place where the person begins or submits the
- 6 application; and
- 7 (2) the state electronic Internet portal project be
- 8 used to authenticate the identity of a person who submits an
- 9 application electronically under this section.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 13.071, Election Code, is amended by
- 11 adding Subsections (a-1) and (c) and amending Subsection (b) to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 (a-1) The registrar shall send each submitted application
- 14 determined eligible for registration to the secretary of state for
- 15 <u>verification</u>.
- SECTION 3. Sections 13.143(a) and (d-2), Election Code, are
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) Except as provided by Subsection [Subsections] (b) [and
- 19 (e)], if an applicant's registration application is approved, the
- 20 registration becomes effective on the 30th day after the date the
- 21 application is approved [submitted to the registrar] or on the date
- 22 the applicant becomes 18 years of age, whichever is later.
- 23 (d-2) For a registration application not submitted by
- 24 personal delivery or mail [telephonic facsimile machine] to be
- 25 effective, a copy of the <u>original</u> registration application
- 26 containing the voter's original signature must be submitted by
- 27 personal delivery or mail and be received by the registrar not later

- 1 than the fourth business day after the <u>submission</u> [transmission by
- 2 telephonic facsimile machine] is received.
- 3 (b) If the application is submitted to the Department of
- 4 Public Safety in conjunction with an application for an original,
- 5 renewal, or duplicate driver's license the application shall be
- 6 approved, rejected, or challenged under this subchapter [The
- 7 registrar shall make the determination of later than the seventh
- 8 day after the date it was [the application is] submitted to the
- 9 registrar.
- 10 (c) If the application is submitted in a manner other than
- 11 the manner described by Subsection (b), the registrar shall forward
- 12 the information relating to the applicant to the secretary of state
- 13 for determining correct information necessary to prevent duplicate
- 14 voter registrations and assess the eligibility of the applicant as
- 15 provided by Section 13.0721. The registrar shall not accept an
- 16 <u>application under this subsection until the secretary of state has</u>
- 17 notified the registrar the applicant meets the requirements of
- 18 Section 13.001. The secretary of state shall adopt rules and
- 19 prescribe procedures to implement this subsection.
- SECTION 4. Section 13.072, Election Code, is amended to
- 21 read as follows:
- Sec. 13.072. ACTION ON APPLICATION. (a) Unless the
- 23 registrar challenges the applicant, the registrar shall approve the
- 24 application if:
- 25 (1) the registrar determines that an application
- 26 complies with Section 13.002 and indicates that the applicant is
- 27 eligible for registration under Section 13.001; and

- 1 (2) for an applicant who has not included a statement
- 2 described by Section 13.002(c)(8)(C), the registrar verifies with
- 3 the secretary of state:
- 4 (A) the applicant's Texas driver's license number
- 5 or number of a personal identification card issued by the
- 6 Department of Public Safety; or
- 7 (B) the last four digits of the applicant's
- 8 social security number.
- 9 (3) for an applicant who has included a statement
- 10 described by Section 13.002(c)(8)(C), the registrar has forwarded
- 11 the application to the secretary of state and the secretary of state
- 12 has verified the identity of the applicant. The secretary of state
- 13 shall adopt rules and prescribe procedures to implement this
- 14 subsection.
- 15 (b) After approval of an application by an applicant who was
- 16 registered in another county at the time of application, the
- 17 registrar shall deliver written notice of the applicant's change of
- 18 residence to the other county's registrar and include in the notice
- 19 the applicant's name, former residence address, and former
- 20 registration number, if known.
- 21 (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), if the registrar
- 22 determines that an application does not comply with Section 13.002
- 23 or does not indicate that the applicant is eligible for
- 24 registration under Section 13.001, the registrar shall reject the
- 25 application.
- 26 (d) If an application clearly indicates that the applicant
- 27 resides in another county, the registrar shall forward the

- 1 application to the other county's registrar not later than the
- 2 second day after the date the application is received [and, if the
- 3 other county is not contiquous, shall deliver written notice of
- 4 that action to the applicant not later than the seventh day after
- 5 the date the application is received]. The date of submission of a
- 6 completed application to the wrong registrar is considered to be
- 7 the date of submission to the proper registrar for purposes of
- 8 determining the effective date of the registration.
- 9 SECTION 5. Section 18.062, Election Code, is amended by
- 10 adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 11 <u>(c) To the extent practicable, a system developed under this</u>
- 12 section shall allow real-time verification of identity,
- 13 <u>eligibility and residency.</u>
- SECTION 6. Section 20.062, Election Code, is amended by
- 15 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as
- 16 follows:
- 17 (a) The Department of Public Safety shall prescribe and use
- 18 a form and procedure that combines the department's application
- 19 form for a license or card with an officially prescribed voter
- 20 registration application form for each United States citizen who
- 21 applies in person at the department's offices or using the
- 22 procedure provided in Section 13.009.
- 23 (d) A procedure prescribed under this section must provide
- 24 for the electronic transmission of an applicant's voter
- 25 registration data by the department to the secretary of state in
- 26 accordance with Section 20.066.
- 27 SECTION 7. Sections 20.063, Election Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 (a) The Department of Public Safety shall provide to each
- 3 <u>United States Citizen</u> person who applies in person or using the
- 4 procedure provided in Section 13.009 [at the department's offices]
- 5 for an original or renewal of a driver's license, a personal
- 6 identification card, or a duplicate or corrected license or card an
- 7 opportunity to complete a voter registration application in a
- 8 simultaneous transaction [form].
- 9 (b) The department shall prescribe and use a change of
- 10 address form and procedure that combines department and voter
- 11 registration functions. The form must allow a licensee or
- 12 cardholder to indicate that [whether] the change of address is not
- 13 [also to be used] for voter registration purposes.
- 14 (c) A change of address that relates to a license or card and
- 15 that is submitted to the department in person, [er] by mail, or
- 16 <u>using the procedure provided in Section 13.009</u> serves as a change of
- 17 address for voter registration unless the licensee or cardholder
- 18 indicates that the change is not for voter registration purposes.
- 19 The date of submission of a change of address to a department
- 20 employee is considered to be the date of submission to the voter
- 21 registrar for the purpose of determining the effective date of
- 22 registration [only].
- SECTION 8. Section 20.065(b), Election Code, is amended to
- 24 read as follows:
- 25 (b) Each weekday the department is regularly open for
- 26 business, the department shall electronically transfer to the
- 27 secretary of state the name and information designated by the

- 1 <u>secretary of state for</u> [of each person who completes a] voter
- 2 registration for each individual who is eligible to vote as
- 3 provided by Section 13.001 and applies in person, by mail, or using
- 4 the procedure provided in Section 13.009 for an original or renewal
- 5 of a driver's license, [application submitted to the department].
- 6 The secretary shall prescribe procedures necessary to implement
- 7 this subsection.
- 8 SECTION 9. Sections 13.143(d) and (e), Election Code, are
- 9 repealed.
- 10 SECTION 10. The changes in law made by this Act apply only
- 11 to an application to register to vote submitted on or after the
- 12 effective date of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
