A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study of the feasibility of establishing a regional
- 3 connected trails system.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. APPLICABILITY. This Act does not apply to
- 6 trails used for motorized vehicles.
- 7 SECTION 2. STUDY. (a) The Parks and Wildlife Department
- 8 shall conduct a study on establishing a regional connected trails
- 9 system throughout the state to provide recreational opportunities
- 10 for Texans and highlight this state's scenery, wildlife, and
- 11 history. The study must evaluate and may develop recommendations
- 12 regarding:
- 13 (1) the feasibility of establishing a regional
- 14 connected trails system;
- 15 (2) proposed locations of regional connected trails;
- 16 (3) strategies for integrating existing trails into a
- 17 regional connected trails system;
- 18 (4) the capacity of the department to oversee a
- 19 regional connected trails system;
- 20 (5) the proposed allocation of state resources to fund
- 21 a regional connected trails system; and
- 22 (6) alternative proposals to increase, connect, and
- 23 protect outdoor recreational trails.
- (b) In conducting the study, the department shall consult

1 with:

- 2 (1) Texas Department of Transportation;
- 3 (2) Texas Historical Commission;
- 4 (3) federal land management agencies; and
- 5 (4) counties and municipalities who maintain parks 6 with relevant trails.
- 7 SECTION 3. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2022, the
- 8 Parks and Wildlife Department shall submit to the governor, the
- 9 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 10 and the chair of each committee of the legislature that has primary
- 11 jurisdiction over the department a written report that summarizes
- 12 the findings of the study conducted and any recommendations
- 13 developed under Section 2 of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. This Act expires February 1, 2023.
- 15 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 16 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 17 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 18 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 19 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
