H.B. No. 4524

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the adoption of rules by the Texas Commission on 3 Environmental Quality regarding the discharge into water in this 4 state of produced water resulting from certain oil and gas 5 activities.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

7 SECTION 1. Section 26.131, Water Code, as effective until 8 delegation of authority under the Resource Conservation and 9 Recovery Act of 1976 (42 U.S.C. Section 6901 et seq.) to the 10 Railroad Commission of Texas, is amended by amending Subsection (d) 11 and adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:

12 (d) The commission may issue permits for the discharge into water in this state of produced water, hydrostatic test water, and 13 14 gas plant effluent resulting from the activities described by Subsection (a) on delegation to the commission of NPDES authority 15 16 for those discharges. The discharge of produced water, hydrostatic test water, and gas plant effluent into water in this state under 17 this subsection must meet the water quality standards established 18 by the commission, including the standards established under 19 20 Subsection (e).

21 (e) The commission shall adopt rules governing the 22 discharge, handling, treatment, and disposition of produced water 23 resulting from the activities described by Subsection (a). Rules 24 adopted under this section must:

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1	(1) be based on the best available science and
2	<pre>technology;</pre>
3	(2) impose standards that exceed the minimum standards
4	established by 40 C.F.R. Parts 435 and 437, as those provisions
5	existed on January 15, 2021;
6	(3) prohibit a discharge of untreated produced water
7	into water in this state;
8	(4) prohibit a discharge of treated produced water
9	into water in this state unless the commission determines that the
10	discharge will not result in water pollution, including a violation
11	of anti-degradation standards;
12	(5) prohibit a discharge of treated produced water to
13	impaired state waters, unless advanced and secondary treatment
14	standards can be implemented that will prevent further degradation
15	of the impaired water;
16	(6) require a person who proposes to discharge treated
17	produced water, or to treat produced water for activities unrelated
18	to oil or gas operations, to provide to the commission for public
19	disclosure the water contaminants in the untreated produced water,
20	including constituents added for oil or gas drilling or production;
21	and
22	(7) require a thorough characterization of all
23	contaminants present in the produced water, including the
24	contaminants' toxicity, mobility, radioactivity, and propensity to
25	bioaccumulate.
26	SECTION 2. Section 26.131, Water Code, as effective upon
27	delegation of authority under the Resource Conservation and

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1 Recovery Act of 1976 (42 U.S.C. Section 6901 et seq.) to the 2 Railroad Commission of Texas, is amended by amending Subsection (c) 3 and adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

4 The commission may issue permits for the discharge into (c) 5 water in this state of produced water, hydrostatic test water, and gas plant effluent resulting from the activities described by 6 Subsection (a) on delegation to the commission of NPDES authority 7 for those discharges. The discharge of produced water, hydrostatic 8 test water, and gas plant effluent into water in this state under 9 10 this subsection must meet the water quality standards established by the commission, including the standards established under 11 12 Subsection (d).

13 (d) The commission shall adopt rules governing the 14 discharge, handling, treatment, and disposition of produced water 15 resulting from the activities described by Subsection (a). Rules 16 adopted under this section must:

17 (1) be based on the best available science and 18 technology;

19 (2) impose standards that exceed the minimum standards 20 established by 40 C.F.R. Parts 435 and 437, as those provisions 21 existed on January 15, 2021;

22 (3) prohibit a discharge of untreated produced water
23 into water in this state;

24 (4) prohibit a discharge of treated produced water 25 into water in this state unless the commission determines that the 26 discharge will not result in water pollution, including a violation 27 of anti-degradation standards;

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(5) prohibit a discharge of treated produced water to 1 2 impaired state waters, unless advanced and secondary treatment 3 standards can be implemented that will prevent further degradation of the impaired water; 4 5 (6) require a person who proposes to discharge treated produced water, or to treat produced water for activities unrelated 6 to oil or gas operations, to provide to the commission for public 7 8 disclosure the water contaminants in the untreated produced water, including constituents added for oil or gas drilling or production; 9 10 and (7) require a thorough characterization of 11 all 12 contaminants present in the produced water, including the contaminants' toxicity, mobility, radioactivity, and propensity to 13 14 bioaccumulate. 15 SECTION 3. (a) Not later than September 1, 2022, the commission shall adopt rules required by Section 26.131, Water 16 17 Code, as amended by this Act. (b) Rules adopted under Section 26.131, Water Code, 18 as amended by this Act, become effective on the effective date of 19 delegation of National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System 20 permit authority for discharges of produced water to the Texas 21 Commission on Environmental Quality by the United 22 States 23 Environmental Protection Agency under Section 402(b) of the Federal 24 Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. Section 1342(b)). SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021. 25

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
