## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the weight limit of certain vehicles.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 621.101, Transportation Code Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 621.101. MAXIMUM WEIGHT OF VEHICLE OR COMBINATION.
- 7 (a) A vehicle or combination of vehicles may not be operated over
- 8 or on a public highway or at a port-of-entry between Texas and the
- 9 United Mexican States if the vehicle or combination has:
- 10 (1) a single axle weight heavier than 20,000 pounds,
- 11 including all enforcement tolerances;
- 12 (1-a) subsection (1) does not apply to vehicles that
- 13 are transporting items that have a reasonable possibility of
- 14 shifting during transit;
- 15 (2) a tandem axle weight heavier than 34,000 pounds,
- 16 including all enforcement tolerances;
- 17 (2-a) subsection (2) does not apply to vehicles that
- 18 are transporting items that have a reasonable possibility of
- 19 shifting during transit;
- 20 (3) an overall gross weight on a group of two or more
- 21 consecutive axles heavier than the weight computed using the
- 22 following formula and rounding the result to the nearest 500
- 23 pounds:
- W = 500((LN/(N-1)) + 12N + 36)

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- 1 where:
- 2 "W" is maximum overall gross weight on the group;
- 3 "L" is distance in feet between the axles of the group
- 4 that are the farthest apart; and
- 5 "N" is number of axles in the group; or
- 6 (4) tires that carry a weight heavier than the weight
- 7 specified and marked on the sidewall of the tire, unless the vehicle
- 8 is being operated under the terms of a special permit.
- 9 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a)(3), two consecutive sets
- 10 of tandem axles may carry a gross load of not more than 34,000
- 11 pounds each if the overall distance between the first and last axles
- 12 of the consecutive sets is 36 feet or more. The overall gross
- 13 weight on a group of two or more consecutive axles may not be
- 14 heavier than 80,000 pounds, including all enforcement tolerances,
- 15 regardless of tire ratings, axle spacing (bridge), and number of
- 16 axles.
- 17 (b-1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section,
- 18 a vehicle or combination of vehicles that is powered by an engine
- 19 fueled primarily by natural gas may exceed any weight limitation
- 20 under this section by an amount that is equal to the difference
- 21 between the weight of the vehicle attributable to the natural gas
- 22 tank and fueling system carried by that vehicle and the weight of a
- 23 comparable diesel tank and fueling system, provided that the
- 24 maximum gross weight of the vehicle or combination of vehicles may
- 25 not exceed 82,000 pounds.
- 26 (c) This section does not:
- 27 (1) authorize size or weight limits on the national

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- 1 system of interstate and defense highways in this state greater
- 2 than those permitted under 23 U.S.C. Section 127, as amended;
- 3 (2) prohibit the operation of a vehicle or combination
- 4 of vehicles that could be lawfully operated on a highway or road of
- 5 this state on December 16, 1974; or
- 6 (3) apply to a vehicle or combination of vehicles that
- 7 operates exclusively:
- 8 (A) at a private port of entry;
- 9 (B) on private roads associated with the port of
- 10 entry; and
- 11 (C) across a public highway between private roads
- 12 associated with the port of entry under a contract under Section
- 13 623.052.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
