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- 2 relating to the powers and duties of the Railroad Commission of
- 3 Texas; providing an administrative penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 Subchapter A, Chapter 81, Subtitle A, Title 3, Natural
- 6 Resources Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 81.058. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY FOR CERTAIN NATURAL
- 8 GAS-RELATED ACTIVITIES.
- 9 (a) The commission, after notice and opportunity for
- 10 hearing, may impose an administrative penalty against a purchaser,
- 11 transporter, gatherer, shipper, or seller of natural gas, a person
- 12 described by Section 81.051(a) or 111.081(a), or any other entity
- 13 under the jurisdiction of the commission under this code that the
- 14 commission determines has:
- 15 (1) violated a commission rule adopting standards or a
- 16 code of conduct for entities in the natural gas industry
- 17 prohibiting unlawful discrimination; or
- 18 (2) unreasonably discriminated against a seller of
- 19 natural gas in the purchase of natural gas from the seller $[\frac{\cdot}{\cdot}]_{+}$ or
- 20 (3) sold natural gas used in the production and
- 21 generation of electricity intended for sale and use on the Texas
- 22 electric grid at an excessive price during a declared disaster.
- 23 (b) The commission, after notice and opportunity for
- 24 hearing, may impose an administrative penalty against a purchaser,

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- 1 transporter, or gatherer of natural gas if the commission
- 2 determines that the person engaged in prohibited discrimination
- 3 against a shipper or seller of natural gas because the shipper or
- 4 seller filed a formal or informal complaint with the commission
- 5 against the person relating to the person's purchase,
- 6 transportation, or gathering of the gas.
- 7 (c) The commission, after notice and opportunity for
- 8 hearing, may impose an administrative penalty against a purchaser,
- 9 transporter, gatherer, shipper, or seller of natural gas who is a
- 10 party to an informal complaint resolution proceeding and is
- 11 determined by the commission to have:
- 12 (1) failed to participate in the proceeding; or
- 13 (2) failed to provide information requested by a
- 14 mediator in the proceeding.
- 15 (d) An administrative penalty imposed under this section
- 16 may not exceed [\$5,000] \$250,000 a day for each violation. Each day
- 17 a violation continues or occurs is a separate violation for
- 18 purposes of imposing a penalty under this section.
- 19 (e) If the commission determines after notice and
- 20 opportunity for hearing that an entity has engaged in prohibited
- 21 discrimination for which a penalty may be imposed under this
- 22 section, the commission may issue any order necessary and
- 23 reasonable to prevent the discrimination from continuing.
- 24 (f) The remedy provided by this section is cumulative of any
- 25 other remedy the commission may order.
- Sec. 81.061. AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH MARKET-BASED RATES.
- 27 (a) This section does not apply to rates established under

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- 1 Chapter 103, Utilities Code, or Subchapter C or G, Chapter 104, of
- 2 that code.
- 3 (b) The commission may use a cost-of-service method or a
- 4 market-based rate method in setting a rate in a formal rate
- 5 proceeding. If the rate case is the result of a complaint filed for
- 6 declared disaster excessive pricing, the commission must use an
- 7 average market price of the three months preceding the declared
- 8 disaster.
- 9 (c) On the filing of a complaint by a shipper or seller of
- 10 natural gas, the commission may set a transportation or gathering
- 11 rate in a formal rate proceeding if the commission determines that
- 12 the rate is necessary to remedy unreasonable discrimination in the
- 13 provision of transportation or gathering services. The commission
- 14 may set a rate regardless of whether the transporter or gatherer is
- 15 classified as a utility by other law.
- 16 (d) On the filing of a complaint of excessive price by a
- 17 power generation company acting as a purchaser of natural gas and
- 18 registered with the Texas Public Utility Commission under
- 19 Substantive Rule 25.5 (54), the commission shall set a rate in a
- 20 formal rate proceeding if the commission determines that the rate
- 21 <u>is necessary to remedy excessive pricing during a declared</u>
- 22 <u>disaster period or shortage.</u>
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
