H.B. No. 4668

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of the Medina County Water Control and Improvement District No. 4; granting a limited power of eminent 3 domain; providing authority to issue bonds; providing authority to 4 5 impose assessments, fees, and taxes. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Subtitle I, Title 6, Special District Local Laws 7 Code, is amended by adding Chapter 9031 to read as follows: 8 9 CHAPTER 9031. MEDINA COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 4 10 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS 11 12 Sec. 9031.0101. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: "Board" means the district's board of directors. 13 (1) (2) "Commission" means the <u>Texas</u> Commission on 14 15 Environmental Quality. 16 (3) "Director" means a board member. (4) "District" means the Medina County Water Control 17 and Improvement District No. 4. 18 Sec. 9031.0102. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a water 19 control and improvement district created under Section 59, Article 20 XVI, Texas Constitution. 21 Sec. 9031.0103. CONFIRMATION AND DIRECTORS' ELECTION 22 23 REQUIRED. The temporary directors shall hold an election to confirm the creation of the district and to elect five permanent 24

1 directors as provided by Section 49.102, Water Code. 2 Sec. 9031.0104. CONSENT OF MUNICIPALITY REQUIRED. The temporary directors may not hold an election under Section 3 9031.0103 until each municipality in whose corporate limits or 4 extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located has 5 consented by ordinance or resolution to the creation of the 6 7 district and to the inclusion of land in the district. 8 Sec. 9031.0105. FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PURPOSE AND BENEFIT. (a) The district is created to serve a public purpose and benefit. 9 10 (b) The district is created to accomplish the purposes of: (1) a water control and improvement district as 11 12 provided by general law and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, including the collection, transportation, 13 processing, disposal, and control of domestic, industrial, or 14 15 communal waste and the gathering, conducting, diverting, and control of local stormwater or other harmful excesses of water; and 16 (2) Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, that 17 relate to the construction, acquisition, improvement, operation, 18 or maintenance of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or 19 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads. 20 21 Sec. 9031.0106. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The district is initially composed of the territory described by 22 23 Section 2 of the Act enacting this chapter. 24 (b) The boundaries and field notes contained in Section 2 of the Act enacting this chapter form a closure. A mistake made in the 25 26 field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative process does not affect the district's: 27

1	(1) organization, existence, or validity;
2	(2) right to issue any type of bond for the purposes
3	for which the district is created or to pay the principal of and
4	interest on a bond;
5	(3) right to impose a tax; or
6	(4) legality or operation.
7	SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS
8	Sec. 9031.0201. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. (a) The district is
9	governed by a board of five elected directors.
10	(b) Except as provided by Section 9031.0202, directors
11	serve staggered four-year terms.
12	Sec. 9031.0202. TEMPORARY DIRECTORS. (a) The temporary
13	board consists of:
14	(1) Jim Welch;
15	(2) Allen Hoover;
16	(3) Matt Baillio;
17	(4) Skip Lietz; and
18	(5) David Higgins.
19	(b) Temporary directors serve until the earlier of:
20	(1) the date permanent directors are elected under
21	Section 9031.0103; or
22	(2) the fourth anniversary of the effective date of
23	the Act enacting this chapter.
24	(c) If permanent directors have not been elected under
25	Section 9031.0103 and the terms of the temporary directors have
26	expired, successor temporary directors shall be appointed or
27	reappointed as provided by Subsection (d) to serve terms that

1 expire on the earlier of: 2 (1) the date permanent directors are elected under 3 Section 9031.0103; or 4 (2) the fourth an<u>niversary of the date of the</u> 5 appointment or reappointment. 6 (d) If Subsection (c) applies, the owner or owners of a 7 majority of the assessed value of the real property in the district may submit a petition to the commission requesting that the 8 commission appoint as successor temporary directors the five 9 persons named in the petition. The commission shall appoint as 10 successor temporary directors the five persons named in the 11 12 petition. SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES 13 Sec. 9031.0301. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The district 14 15 has the powers and duties necessary to accomplish the purposes for which the district is created. 16 Sec. 9031.0302. WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT 17 POWERS AND DUTIES. The district has the powers and duties provided 18 by the general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 51, 19 Water Code, applicable to water control and improvement districts 20 created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and 21 specifically including the powers and duties authorized under 22 Subchapter H, Chapter 51, Water Code. 23 24 Sec. 9031.0303. AUTHORITY FOR ROAD PROJECTS. Under Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, the district may design, 25 26 acquire, construct, finance, issue bonds for, improve, operate, maintain, and convey to this state, a county, or a municipality for 27

1	operation and maintenance macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or
2	improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads.
3	Sec. 9031.0304. ROAD STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS. (a) A
4	road project must meet all applicable construction standards,
5	subdivision requirements, and regulations of each municipality in
6	whose corporate limits or extraterritorial jurisdiction the road
7	project is located.
8	(b) If a road project is not located in the corporate limits
9	or extraterritorial jurisdiction of a municipality, the road
10	project must meet all applicable construction standards, zoning and
11	subdivision requirements, and regulations of each county in which
12	the road project is located.
13	(c) If the state will maintain and operate the road, the
14	Texas Transportation Commission must approve the plans and
15	specifications of the road project.
16	Sec. 9031.0305. COMPLIANCE WITH MUNICIPAL CONSENT
17	ORDINANCE OR RESOLUTION. The district shall comply with all
18	applicable requirements of any ordinance or resolution that is
19	adopted under Section 42.042 or 42.0425, Local Government Code, and
20	consents to the creation of the district or to the inclusion of land
21	in the district.
22	SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS
23	Sec. 9031.0401. ELECTIONS REGARDING TAXES OR BONDS. (a)
24	The district may issue, without an election, bonds and other
25	obligations secured by:
26	(1) revenue other than ad valorem taxes; or
27	(2) contract payments described by Section 9031.0403.

1	(b) The district must hold an election in the manner
2	provided by Chapters 49 and 51, Water Code, to obtain voter approval
3	before the district may impose an ad valorem tax or issue bonds
4	payable from ad valorem taxes.
5	(c) The district may not issue bonds payable from ad valorem
6	taxes to finance a road project unless the issuance is approved by a
7	vote of a two-thirds majority of the district voters voting at an
8	election held for that purpose.
9	Sec. 9031.0402. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX. (a) If
10	authorized at an election held under Section 9031.0401, the
11	district may impose an operation and maintenance tax on taxable
12	property in the district in accordance with Section 49.107, Water
13	Code.
14	(b) The board shall determine the tax rate. The rate may not
15	exceed the rate approved at the election.
16	Sec. 9031.0403. CONTRACT TAXES. (a) In accordance with
17	Section 49.108, Water Code, the district may impose a tax other than
18	an operation and maintenance tax and use the revenue derived from
19	the tax to make payments under a contract after the provisions of
20	the contract have been approved by a majority of the district voters
21	voting at an election held for that purpose.
22	(b) A contract approved by the district voters may contain a
23	provision stating that the contract may be modified or amended by
24	the board without further voter approval.
25	SUBCHAPTER E. BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS
26	Sec. 9031.0501. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER
27	OBLIGATIONS. The district may issue bonds or other obligations

payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, impact fees, 1 revenue, contract payments, grants, or other district money, or any 2 3 combination of those sources, to pay for any authorized district 4 purpose. 5 Sec. 9031.0502. TAXES FOR BONDS. At the time the district issues bonds payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, the 6 board shall provide for the annual imposition of a continuing 7 8 direct ad valorem tax, without limit as to rate or amount, while all or part of the bonds are outstanding as required and in the manner 9 10 provided by Section 51.433, Water Code. Sec. 9031.0503. BONDS FOR ROAD PROJECTS. At the time of 11

11 <u>set. 9031.0303. BONDS FOR ROAD PROJECTS. At the time of</u> 12 <u>issuance, the total principal amount of bonds or other obligations</u> 13 <u>issued or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad</u> 14 <u>valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of the</u> 15 <u>real property in the district.</u>

16 SECTION 2. The Medina County Water Control and Improvement 17 District No. 4 initially includes all the territory contained in 18 the following area:

3 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to 4 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this 5 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a 6 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies, 7 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished 8 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313, 9 Government Code.

10 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has 11 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on 12 Environmental Quality.

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed 13 (C) 14 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the 15 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives within the required time. 16

17 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this 18 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect 19 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled 20 and accomplished.

SECTION 4. (a) If this Act does not receive a two-thirds vote of all the members elected to each house, Subchapter C, Chapter 9031, Special District Local Laws Code, as added by Section 1 of this Act, is amended by adding Section 9031.0306 to read as follows: <u>Sec. 9031.0306. NO EMINENT DOMAIN POWER. The district may</u> not exercise the power of eminent domain.

3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
