## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, In recent years, the Hill Country community of Llano
- 2 has become known throughout Texas as a thriving center for the sport
- 3 of barrel racing; and
- WHEREAS, The John L. Kuykendall Event Center and Arena
- 5 attracts a multitude of competitors and fans to the city, and the
- 6 Llano Chamber of Commerce estimates that the economic impact from
- 7 barrel racing exceeds \$1 million annually; and
- 8 WHEREAS, From 2016 to 2020, the number of barrel races held at
- 9 the JLK Arena grew by 200 percent, with total annual race days
- 10 increasing from 50 to 120; approximately 150 events are slated to
- 11 take place in 2021, and the venue is also used for practice sessions
- 12 for several days each week; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Renowned as one of the safest barrel racing
- 14 facilities in Texas, the JLK Arena has been honored with a Justin
- 15 Boots Best Footing Award from the Women's Professional Rodeo
- 16 Association in recognition of the exceptional ground conditions at
- 17 its races; over the past five years, there have been only two
- 18 recorded incidents in which horses slipped and lost their footing
- 19 in competition, a remarkable record for a rodeo venue; and
- WHEREAS, Barrel racing is a source of pride and prosperity
- 21 for the residents of Llano, and the city's efforts to showcase the
- 22 sport are furthering the rich rodeo heritage of the Lone Star State;
- 23 now, therefore, be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the 87th Legislature of the State of Texas

- 1 hereby designate Llano as the official Barrel Racing Capital of
- 2 Texas; and, be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of Section
- 4 391.003(e), Government Code, this designation remain in effect
- 5 until the 10th anniversary of the date this resolution is finally
- 6 passed by the legislature.
