CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Adolescent mental health is a topic of critical 2 concern that has far-ranging implications in Texas and across the 3 nation; and

WHEREAS, The American Psychological Association estimates that approximately 20 percent of children in the U.S. have a diagnosable mental health disorder, and less than half of these individuals receive treatment or support; common conditions that affect youth include depression, anxiety, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, conduct disorder, eating disorders, and psychosis; and

11 WHEREAS, Mental health disorders can have dangerous and 12 life-threatening impacts on the youth that experience them; suicide 13 is the third leading cause of death in teenagers aged 15 to 19, and 14 62,000 adolescents worldwide died as a result of self-harm in 2016; 15 furthermore, evidence shows that many adolescents engage in 16 risk-taking behaviors and substance abuse as a means of coping with 17 mental health issues; and

18 WHEREAS, Too many young Texans lack access to the treatment 19 and counseling they need to overcome such challenges; moreover, 20 those adolescents who do receive some form of assistance are 21 frequently involved with multiple public agencies, and there is 22 lack of central oversight to coordinate care; and

23 WHEREAS, Developing effective strategies and expanding 24 access to treatment can benefit not only the young people who

1 struggle with adverse mental health conditions but also their 2 families, schools, and communities, and an essential first step in 3 that process is to focus public attention on this urgent health care 4 issue; now, therefore, be it

5 RESOLVED, That the 87th Legislature of the State of Texas 6 hereby designate May 5 as Teen Mental Health Awareness Day; and, be 7 it further

8 RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of Section 9 391.004(d), Government Code, this designation remain in effect 10 until the 10th anniversary of the date this resolution is finally 11 passed by the legislature.
