9 wildlife, including such signature Texas animals as the javelina,

the western diamondback rattlesnake, the roadrunner, and the 10

12 the mountain lion, the black bear, and the peregrine falcon; and

14 Texans young and old have abundant opportunities to

recreational pursuits and to learn about the wonders of the natural 15

16 world, and the great Texas outdoors contributes to economic

vitality as well; visitors are drawn to the state for fishing, 17
