H.J.R. No. 10

A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 proposing a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature
2 to enact laws providing for a court to grant a commutation of
3 punishment to a person who has successfully served the required
4 number of years on parole.

5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 11(a), Article IV, Texas Constitution,
7 is amended to read as follows:

8 (a) The Legislature shall by law establish a Board of
9 Pardons and Paroles and shall require it to keep record of its
10 actions and the reasons for its actions. The Legislature shall have
11 authority to enact parole laws, including laws authorizing a court
12 to grant a commutation of punishment to a person who has
13 successfully served the specified number of years on parole
14 required by law, and laws that require or permit courts to inform
15 juries about the effect of good conduct time and eligibility for
16 parole or mandatory supervision on the period of incarceration
17 served by a defendant convicted of a criminal offense.

18 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
19 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 2, 2021.
20 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
21 proposition: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the
22 legislature to enact laws providing for a court to grant a
23 commutation of punishment to a person who has successfully served
24 the required number of years on parole."
