A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment to repeal the mandatory age of
- 2 retirement for state justices and judges.
- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 1-a(1), Article V, Texas Constitution,
- 5 is amended to read as follows:
- 6 (1) Subject to the further provisions of this Section,
- 7 the Legislature shall provide for the retirement and compensation
- 8 of Justices and Judges of the Appellate Courts and District and
- 9 Criminal District Courts on account of length of service, age and
- 10 disability, and for their reassignment to active duty where and
- 11 when needed. [The office of every such Justice and Judge shall
- 12 become vacant on the expiration of the term during which the
- 13 incumbent reaches the age of seventy-five (75) years or such
- 14 earlier age, not less than seventy (70) years, as the Legislature
- 15 may prescribe, except that if a Justice or Judge elected to serve or
- 16 fill the remainder of a six-year term reaches the age of
- 17 seventy-five (75) years during the first four years of the term, the
- 18 office of that Justice or Judge shall become vacant on December 31
- 19 of the fourth year of the term to which the Justice or Judge was
- 20 elected.]
- 21 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 22 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 2, 2021.
- 23 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 24 proposition: "The constitutional amendment to repeal the mandatory
