RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The football team from the Texas School for the Deaf 2 in Austin closed out an unforgettable season by capturing the Texas 3 Association of Private and Parochial Schools Six-Man Division I 4 state championship on December 11, 2020; and

5 WHEREAS, Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, TSD was forced to 6 switch from 11-man to six-man football for the first time in its 7 history during 2020; undeterred, the Rangers claimed the TAPPS 8 District 5 title and then maintained their momentum in the 9 playoffs; they defeated Logos Preparatory Academy before knocking 10 off San Marcos Academy to advance to the state title contest; and

11 WHEREAS, Matching up against the previously unbeaten squad 12 from Veritas Academy in the finale, TSD took an early 22-8 lead in 13 the first quarter and never looked back; when the final seconds 14 ticked away, the Rangers brought the year to a triumphant end with a 15 63-32 victory, earning the first football state championship in the 16 164-year history of the school; and

WHEREAS, The success enjoyed by the TSD players was the 17 result of an exceptional team effort, with valuable contributions 18 being made by each member of the roster; a total of eight players 19 received All-District honors, and Jordan Leeper, Zarek Nathanson, 20 21 and Russell Rohde were honored by the Austin American-Statesman for their exceptional efforts in the championship game; the Rangers 22 23 were guided throughout their winning season by head coach John Moore Jr. and assistant coaches Joshua Moore, Harvey Nathanson, and 24

2 WHEREAS, Demonstrating inspiring perseverance during a 3 season that was nearly cancelled because of the pandemic, the TSD 4 team earned national attention from such media outlets as NBC's 5 *Today* show and ESPN's *SportsCenter*; the Rangers' achievement was 6 all the more special in that it marked a new level of football 7 success for an institution that is considered one of the oldest 8 continually operating public schools in Texas; and

9 WHEREAS, Winning a state championship is a daunting task that 10 requires countless hours of hard work and an unwavering commitment 11 to excellence, and the members of the Texas School for the Deaf 12 football team may take justifiable pride in their historic 13 accomplishments on the gridiron; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 87th Texas Legislature hereby congratulate the Texas School for the Deaf football team on winning the 2020 TAPPS Six-Man Division I state championship and extend to the team's players, coaches, and staff sincere best wishes for continued success; and, be it further
