WHEREAS, Originally known as the Soil Conservation Service, 4 5 the NRCS is a program of the U.S. Department of Agriculture that and ranchers with assistance provides farmers in 6 making conservation improvements to their land; the National Individual 7 Civil Rights Award recognizes a person who has made a significant 8 9 contribution to the agency's civil rights program; and

WHEREAS, Growing up on a cattle ranch in Eagle Pass, Bertha 10 11 Venegas raised show lambs and won college scholarships from the 12 Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo; after earning her bachelor's degree in agriculture at Southwest Texas State University, she 13 14 joined the SCS in 1988 and began her career as a technician in her hometown; she was promoted to district conservationist in Johnson 15 16 City, and in 1997, she became an NRCS resource conservation and development coordinator in San Antonio; appointed as a state 17 outreach specialist in 2011, she now works out of the field office 18 in Boerne; and 19

20 WHEREAS, Ms. Venegas has served as acting national Hispanic 21 Emphasis Program manager, and she focuses her efforts on 22 historically underserved farmers and ranchers; in 2018, she 23 established the Texas Urban and Rural Conservation Project and 24 Project G.R.E.E.N. (Growing Roots for Education, Environment, and

1 Nutrition), a grant program directed at schools; in 2020, she 2 oversaw the distribution of more than \$175,000 through TURCP and 3 \$112,000 through Project G.R.E.E.N.; and

4 WHEREAS, Ms. Venegas has won the National Individual Civil 5 Rights Award once before, in 1997, and she has also been recognized as Outstanding RC&D Coordinator for the Southwest Region of RC&D 6 Councils and received Visionary and Leadership Awards from the 7 8 National Organization of Professional Hispanic NRCS Employees, as well as a Service Award from the Latinos in Agriculture 9 organization; in addition to her post in Boerne, she is also Farm 10 Production and Conservation beginning farmer 11 and rancher 12 coordinator for Texas, advisor to the Texas Civil Rights Advisory Committee, and the Texas limited English proficiency coordinator; 13 14 and

WHEREAS, Bertha Venegas's dedication, expertise, and commitment to civil rights outreach have greatly benefited the farmers and ranchers of the Lone Star State, and she may indeed take great pride in this prestigious recognition of her many achievements; now, therefore, be it
