5 fortunate; and

6 WHEREAS, Texas is home to more than 400,000 Muslims who

7 contribute in numerous ways to the economic, cultural, and social

8 fabric of our great state; Ramadan is a profoundly important and

9 meaningful time for members of this vibrant community, and the

10 customs that accompany Ramadan are emblematic of the rich and

11 diverse traditions that define Muslim cultures; and

12 WHEREAS, During Ramadan, Muslims abstain from food and drink

13 from sunrise until sunset in an effort to deepen their faith and to

14 better understand the plight of the poor and hungry; Muslims break

15 their daily fasts by sharing meals with family and friends, and the

16 end of Ramadan is celebrated with a three-day festival known as Eid

17 al-Fitr; this year, Ramadan is expected to begin on April 12, with

18 the sighting of the crescent moon, and continue until the evening of

19 May 12, 2021; and

20 WHEREAS, While focusing on their spiritual growth during

21 Ramadan, Muslims affirm their commitment to working toward the

22 collective good of society and the well-being of people from all

23 walks of life, and it is indeed fitting to acknowledge the

24 significance of this special occasion to people of the Muslim faith
