

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, People across the State of Texas are observing the
2 71st annual National Day of Prayer on May 5, 2022; and

3 WHEREAS, The United States has a long-standing tradition of
4 public prayer dating back to the earliest days of its founding; in
5 1775, the Second Continental Congress issued a proclamation calling
6 for a day of prayer for the fledgling nation, and during the ensuing
7 decades and centuries, special days of prayer were issued by state
8 and federal elected leaders; President Abraham Lincoln famously
9 proclaimed a national day of prayer and fasting in the midst of the
10 calamitous Civil War, calling upon citizens of the war-torn states
11 to humble themselves before the Almighty; and

12 WHEREAS, The National Day of Prayer was made an annual event
13 when President Harry Truman signed a joint resolution by Congress
14 in 1952; the permanent date was set in 1988 when President Ronald
15 Reagan signed the public law designating the first Thursday in May
16 for the observance; and

17 WHEREAS, Throughout the history of our nation, in times of
18 crisis and of calm, Americans have turned to prayer for strength,
19 guidance, and inspiration, and the National Day of Prayer provides
20 an opportunity for citizens from all walks of life to join together
21 on a special occasion of fellowship, unity, and hope for our common
22 future; now, therefore, be it

23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 87th Texas
24 Legislature hereby recognize May 5, 2022, as National Day of Prayer
