RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, On Mother's Day, May 8, 2022, sons and daughters 2 across Texas and the nation will make an extra effort to honor those special women who raised them and to celebrate the fundamental and 3 enduring institution of motherhood; and 4 5 WHEREAS, This annual celebration took root in the years before the Civil War, when Ann Reeves Jarvis organized "Mother's 6 7 Day Work Clubs" to reduce child mortality by improving sanitation conditions and to help nurse and provide medicine for the sick; 8 after the war, Mrs. Jarvis created "Mother's Friendship Day"; and 9

WHEREAS, After the death of Ann Reeves Jarvis in 1905, her daughter, Anna Jarvis, envisioned a regular observance of Mother's Day, when individuals would visit their mothers or attend church while wearing white carnations, her own mother's favorite flower; in May 1908, Miss Jarvis arranged for a Mother's Day celebration to be held at St. Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia;

16 and WHEREAS, Anna Jarvis went on to establish the Mother's Day 17 18 International Association, and she embarked upon a letter-writing campaign urging legislators across the nation to adopt the holiday; 19 by 1912, many states, communities, and churches across the country 20 21 had begun to celebrate Mother's Day, and in 1914, President Woodrow Wilson created the national holiday by officially designating the 22 23 second Sunday in May as a "public expression of our love and reverence for the mothers of our country"; and 24
