- 1 WHEREAS, The football team from Lakehill Preparatory School
- 2 in Dallas closed out an unforgettable season by capturing the Texas
- 3 Association of Private and Parochial Schools Six-Man Division II
- 4 state championship on December 18, 2020; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Following an undefeated regular season, the
- 6 Warriors continued their outstanding performance in the playoffs,
- 7 racking up victories against Heritage Christian Academy, San
- 8 Jacinto Christian Academy, Live Oak Classical School, and Coram Deo
- 9 Academy to advance to the title game; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Returning to the state finale for the second year in
- 11 a row, Lakehill faced off against Allen Academy in what proved to be
- 12 a dramatic showdown; the Warriors struck early, going up 20-0 in the
- 13 first quarter, but the Rams fought back to take the lead in the
- 14 second half; trailing by the score of 34-26, the Lakehill players
- 15 staged a nine-play touchdown drive, including a crucial fourth-down

- 18 after an Allen punt and exploded on first down for a 62-yard
- 19 game-winning score; with the title on the line, the Lakehill
- 20 defense stopped Allen on fourth down to secure a 42-34 triumph and
- 21 the school's first state crown in six-man football; and

- 6 sophomore Ma'Ki Shaw; and freshmen Nicholas Blanchard, Austin
- 7 Boothe, Maxwell Byrd, Nicholas Meadows, Devon Moore, Leyton
- 8 Scruggs, Connor Wallace, and Jack Widhalm; these determined student
- 9 athletes were ably guided by head coach Jairus Mitchell and
- 10 assistant coaches Phireese Jones, Jayson Smith, and Michael Jones;
- 11 they also received strong support from athletic director Bob
- 12 Yttredahl, headmaster Roger Perry, and assistant headmaster Patti
