## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Reginald Wayne Moore of Houston passed away on July 2 3, 2020, at the age of 60, leaving his loved ones and his many 3 colleagues and admirers to reflect on his unwavering dedication to the pursuit of social justice and racial healing; and 4 5 WHEREAS, A native of Houston, Reginald Moore was the son of Melvin Moore Roberts and Jerline Lee Moore and the brother of four 6 7 siblings, Anthony, Sonya, Bridgette, and Cassandra; in 1978, he

graduated from Jack Yates High School, where he was a talented member of the football team, and he went on to continue his studies 9

at Northwestern State University of Louisiana; and 10

11 WHEREAS, Mr. Moore served as a state correctional officer 12 from 1985 to 1988 and also worked for a time as a longshoreman and a real estate agent and broker; while a guard at the Jester State 13 14 Prison Farm outside of Sugar Land, he began researching the history of convict leasing, a form of forced labor that was used to exploit 15 Black inmates after the abolishment of slavery; following his 16 retirement, he dedicated himself full-time to the project, but he 17 had little success in bringing attention to the brutality of the 18 system until 2018, when a mass unmarked grave containing the 19 remains of 95 African American convict laborers was unearthed on 20 21 the grounds of a former state prison farm in Fort Bend County; and 22 WHEREAS, Mr. Moore's decades-long research efforts were

validated by the discovery of the so-called "Sugar Land 95," which

made headlines internationally; that same year, he founded the

- 1 Convict Leasing and Labor Project, and he continued to collaborate
- 2 and share his findings with other historians and researchers; one
- 3 of his proudest achievements was his persuasive testimony before
- 4 the Texas Board of Education that led to the approval of the state's
- 5 first African American studies course as a high school elective;

- WHEREAS, A devoted husband and father, Mr. Moore was blessed
- 8 with the love and support of his wife of 21 years, Marilyn Collins
- 9 Moore, and he cherished his five children, Reginald Jeremy, El
- 10 Xemenes Love, Tirhakah Tarique Love, Mario Hinkle, and Rhae Hinkle,
- 11 as well as his nieces and nephews; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Through his uncompromising quest for the truth,
- 13 Reginald Moore played a vital role in addressing the insidious
- 14 legacy of convict leasing and restoring dignity to its victims, and
- 15 his memory will forever be treasured by the many people whose lives
- 16 he touched; now, therefore, be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 87th Texas
- 18 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Reginald Wayne Moore
- 19 and extend deepest sympathy to all those who mourn his passing; and,

- 22 prepared for his family and that when the Texas House of
- 23 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Reginald
