RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Rod Humphries, an Australian-born author, sports 2 journalist, and television writer, has added U.S. citizenship to 3 his long list of achievements; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Humphries began his extensive career in sports 4 5 journalism with the Sydney Morning Herald and its sister newspaper, the Sun Herald; over many years as an international sports 6 7 columnist, he has had the opportunity to interview sports icons such as track and field legend Jesse Owens and heavyweight boxing 8 9 champion Joe Frazier and to cover some of the most memorable events in the world of sports; in 1975, he made his foray into television 10 11 as the head writer of Australia's award-winning This is Your Life program, and in 1976, he was the subject of a national documentary 12 called Action Replay that chronicled a day in his life as a sports 13 journalist; and 14

WHEREAS, After traveling to the United States to write a book 15 16 on tennis in 1977, Mr. Humphries was offered a job by Lamar Hunt, the famed Texas oilman and sports promoter, in his World 17 Championship Tennis organization; beginning as its director of 18 public relations and tournaments, Mr. Humphries later became chief 19 operating officer of WCT, an international tour that spanned 12 20 21 countries; in 1980 and 1981, he wrote tennis specials about the WCT tour for ESPN, which were some of the first documentaries produced 22 23 by the network in its early days; from 1986 to 1988, he was the media director for the Lipton International Players Championship; and 24

1 WHEREAS, As he settled into his new home in the U.S., Mr. Humphries continued to write regular columns and produce radio 2 3 reports for Australian audiences on American and international sports; his column "This is America" appeared in the Sun Herald, and 4 5 his column "Stateside" was published in the national newspaper The Australian for more than a decade; he also authored the bestseller 6 Lionel Rose: Australian about the indigenous Australian boxer, 7 8 along with several other books, Love and Faults, The Doberman Pinscher, and Little League to the Major Leagues; and 9

WHEREAS, For more than four decades, the United States has benefited from the hard work, talent, and dedication that Rod Humphries has brought to all of his endeavors, and it is a pleasure to recognize him as he celebrates the culmination of his long journey to American citizenship; now, therefore, be it
