1           WHEREAS, Vanderbilt University athlete and Wylie native  
2 Sarah Fuller made history on November 28, 2020, when she became the  
3 first woman to appear in a college football game in one of the  
4 sport's Power 5 conferences; and

5           WHEREAS, Ms. Fuller is a graduate of Wylie High School, where  
6 she was captain of the soccer team, and she now attends Vanderbilt  
7 on a soccer scholarship; days after she helped her team win the  
8 Southeastern Conference soccer championship, she joined the  
9 university's football squad as a last-minute replacement due to the  
10 COVID-19 outbreak; she made her groundbreaking debut on a  
11 second-half kickoff in the game against the University of Missouri,  
12 and in the following game against the University of Tennessee on  
13 December 12, she kicked two extra points to become the first woman  
14 to score in a Power 5 game; and

15           WHEREAS, In recognition of her achievements, Ms. Fuller has  
16 garnered a multitude of accolades and received international media  
17 attention, and the Wylie City Council proclaimed January 12, 2021,  
18 to be Sarah Fuller Day; and

19           WHEREAS, Sarah Fuller's pioneering efforts on the gridiron  
20 have inspired fans across the Lone Star State and around the globe,  
21 and she may indeed reflect with pride on her outstanding  
22 accomplishments; now, therefore, be it

23           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 87th Texas  
24 Legislature hereby congratulate Sarah Fuller on being the first

2 competition and extend to her sincere best wishes for continued
