WHEREAS, San Antonio businessman Charles E. Williams Sr. has earned the admiration of innumerable people as a pillar of the East

3 Side community; and

WHEREAS, Born in Granger in 1937, Charles Williams grew up on 4 5 a farm and excelled as an athlete at the Crispus Attucks High School; after graduating from Tyler Barber College, he moved to San 6 7 Antonio and rented a chair at Taylor's Barber Shop; he opened his own establishment six years later and then became the first African 8 9 American to buy property on W. W. White Road; active in the civil rights movement, he took part in marches, picket lines, and lunch 10 counter demonstrations; he also advocated for the renaming of 11

12 Nebraska Street in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.; and WHEREAS, Mr. Williams opened many successful businesses over 13 14 the years, including a beauty supply store, a catering company, and a car wash, and he invested in residential real estate, as well; in 15 16 the early 1990s, he founded Williams Barber College, which became an East Side institution, and he was appointed chair of the State 17 Board of Barber Examiners; he mentored many aspiring entrepreneurs 18 and eventually sold the school to a younger barber; dedicated to the 19 20 community, he served on the city's zoning commission; when he opened the Landmark Coffee Shop in a renovated building in 2009, he 21 included community meeting space and displayed portraits of local 22 23 luminaries who had inspired his drive for excellence; he has
