RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, July 5, 2021, is the 75th anniversary of the signing 2 of the Lanham Act by President Harry S. Truman, marking a 3 significant milestone in the effort to protect American consumers 4 and manufacturers from the proliferation of counterfeit goods; and

5 WHEREAS, Counterfeit products undermine laws, threaten the economy, and pose both potential and actual harm to consumers in 6 7 Texas and across the nation; in April 2021, the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development reported that counterfeit 8 9 goods were on the rise, constituting as much as 3.3 percent of globally traded goods at a cost of \$500 billion; there are 10 11 approximately 180,000 registered trademarks owned by Texas businesses and more than 2.5 million active trademarks in the 12 United States, and each year, brand owners ranging from small 13 14 businesses to major corporations collectively spend billions of dollars to remove counterfeit products from circulation; and 15

16 WHEREAS, Also known as the Trademark Act of 1946, the Lanham modern federal trademark Act provides the foundation for 17 protection, creating remedies for brand owners and helping 18 consumers by reducing the number of counterfeit and confusingly 19 20 similar products in the marketplace; cited in over 50 Supreme Court 21 decisions and 54,000 cases in state and federal courts, the act has helped establish a nationwide framework for the protection of 22 23 logos, words, phrases, names, packaging, scents, shapes, colors, and other elements of trademark; these measures help protect the 24

H.R. No. 1962 1 integrity of consumer goods ranging from soap and toothpaste to 2 pharmaceuticals and military equipment; and

3 WHEREAS, The primary sponsor of the act was Fritz Lanham of Fort Worth, who represented the 12th Congressional District in the 4 5 U.S. House of Representatives from 1919 to 1947; during his remarkable 27-year tenure, he served as chair of the House 6 7 Committee on Public Buildings and Grounds, playing a vital role in 8 the construction of such important federal buildings as the Pan American Union Building, the Longworth House Office Building, and 9 many U.S. courthouses and post offices; he also served on the 10 Supreme Court Building Commission under former president and chief 11 12 justice William Howard Taft, helping to oversee the construction of the U.S. Supreme Court building, on time and under budget; and 13

14 WHEREAS, For 75 years, the Lanham Act has enabled the 15 U.S. Patent and Trademark Office to administer a strong and 16 effective federal trademark system, and in so doing, this important 17 legislation has helped protect both brand owners and consumers in 18 the marketplace; now, therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 87th Texas 20 Legislature hereby commemorate the 75th anniversary of the passage 21 of the Lanham Act and pay tribute to the life and legacy of 22 U.S. Representative Fritz Lanham.
