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## RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the State of 1 Texas, 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, That House Rule 13, 2 3 Section 9(a), be suspended in part as provided by House Rule 13, Section 9(f), to enable the conference committee appointed to 4 resolve the differences on House Bill 4305 (the use of municipal 5 hotel occupancy tax revenue in certain municipalities, 6 the 7 entitlement of certain municipalities to certain tax revenue related to certain hotel and other projects, and the rate and 8 applicability of and use of revenue from the hotel occupancy tax in 9 10 certain counties; authorizing the imposition of a tax; changing the maximum rate of a tax) to consider and take action on the following 11 matter: 12

House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(4), is suspended to permit the committee to add text on a matter not included in either the house or senate version of the bill in proposed SECTION 2 of the bill, by amending Section 351.152, Tax Code, to read as follows:

Explanation: This change is necessary to expand the applicability of Subchapter C, Chapter 351, Tax Code, relating to municipal hotel and convention center projects, to a municipality that is the county seat of a county that borders the Gulf of Mexico and the United Mexican States.
