5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 12, Utilities Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 12.0521 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 12.0521. PRESIDING OFFICER QUALIFICATIONS. The
9	commissioner designated as the presiding officer must be a resident
10	of this state.
11	SECTION 2. Section 13.022(a), Utilities Code, is amended to
12	read as follows:
13	(a) The counsellor must:
14	(1) be licensed to practice law in this state <u>and a</u>
15	resident of this state;
16	(2) have demonstrated a strong commitment to and
17	involvement in efforts to safeguard the rights of the public; and
18	(3) possess the knowledge and experience necessary to
19	practice effectively in utility proceedings.
20	SECTION 3. Section 39.151, Utilities Code, is amended by
21	amending Subsections (d), (g), and (g-1) and adding Subsections
22	(g-2), (g-3), (g-4), (g-5), and (g-6) to read as follows:
23	(d) The commission shall adopt and enforce rules relating to
24	the reliability of the regional electrical network and accounting

for the production and delivery of electricity among generators and 1 2 all other market participants, or may delegate to an independent organization responsibilities for <u>adopting</u> [establishing] 3 or 4 enforcing such rules. Rules [Any such rules] adopted by an independent organization and [any] enforcement actions taken by the 5 organization under delegated authority from the commission are 6 7 subject to commission oversight and review and may not take effect before receiving commission approval. An independent organization 8 9 certified by the commission is directly responsible and accountable 10 to the commission. The commission has complete authority to 11 oversee and investigate the organization's finances, budget, and 12 operations necessary to ensure the organization's as accountability and to ensure that the organization adequately 13 performs the organization's functions and duties. The organization 14 15 shall fully cooperate with the commission in the commission's 16 oversight and investigatory functions. The commission may take appropriate action against an organization that does not adequately 17 perform the organization's functions or duties or does not comply 18 with this section, including decertifying the organization or 19 20 assessing an administrative penalty against the organization. The 21 commission by rule shall adopt procedures governing 22 decertification of an independent organization, selecting and certifying a successor organization, and transferring assets to the 23 24 successor organization to ensure continuity of operations in the 25 region. The commission may not implement, by order or by rule, a requirement that is contrary to an applicable federal law or rule. 26 27 (g) To maintain certification as an independent

organization for the ERCOT power region under this section, an organization's governing body must be composed of persons <u>selected</u> <u>by the ERCOT board selection committee</u> [specified by this section and selected in accordance with formal bylaws or protocols of the organization].

6 (g-1) The independent organization's bylaws or protocols 7 must be approved by the commission and must reflect the input of the [The bylaws must specify the process by which 8 commission. 9 appropriate stakeholders elect members and, for unaffiliated 10 members, prescribe professional qualifications for selection as a 11 member.] The bylaws must require that every member of the governing body be a resident of this state and must prohibit a legislator from 12 serving as a member [the use of a professional search firm to 13 identify candidates for membership of unaffiliated members. The 14 process must allow for commission input in identifying candidates]. 15 16 The governing body must be composed of:

17 (1) the chairman of the commission as an ex officio 18 nonvoting member;

the counsellor as an ex officio voting member 19 (2) representing residential and small commercial consumer interests; 20 the chief executive officer of the independent 21 (3) 22 organization as an ex officio nonvoting [voting] member; and eight members selected by the selection committee 23 (4)under Section 39.1513 with executive-level experience in any of the 24 25 following professions: 26 (A) finance;

1	(g-3) A person does not qualify for selection as a member of
2	the governing body of an independent organization for the ERCOT
3	power region if the person has a fiduciary duty or assets in the
4	electricity market for that region.
5	(g-4) To maintain certification as an independent
6	organization under this section, the organization's governing body
7	may not include more than two members who are employed by an
8	institution of higher education, as defined by Section 61.003,
9	Education Code, in a professorial role.
10	(g-5) A former member of the governing body of an
11	independent organization certified under this section may not,
12	before the second anniversary of the date the member ceases to be a

13 member of the governing body, engage in an activity that requires 14 registration under Chapter 305, Government Code.

15 (g-6) To maintain certification as an independent 16 organization under this section, the organization's governing body 17 must establish and implement a formal process for adopting new 18 protocols or revisions to existing protocols. The process must 19 require that new or revised protocols may not take effect until the 20 commission approves a market impact statement describing the new or 21 revised protocols.

22 SECTION 4. Subchapter D, Chapter 39, Utilities Code, is 23 amended by adding Section 39.1513 to read as follows:

6 <u>(c) A member of the committee is not entitled to</u> 7 <u>compensation for serving as a member but is entitled to</u> 8 <u>reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in</u> 9 <u>performing the official duties of office.</u>

10 <u>(d) The committee shall select members eligible under</u> 11 <u>Section 39.151 to serve on the governing body of an independent</u> 12 <u>organization certified under that section for the ERCOT power</u> 13 <u>region and shall designate the chair and vice chair of the governing</u> 14 <u>body from those members.</u>

15 (e) The ERCOT board selection committee shall retain an 16 outside consulting firm to help select members of the governing 17 body under Subsection (d).

18 SECTION 5. An independent organization certified under 19 Section 39.151, Utilities Code, by the Public Utility Commission of 20 Texas before September 1, 2021, shall modify the organization to 21 comply with Section 39.151, Utilities Code, as amended by this Act. 22 After September 1, 2021, the Public Utility Commission of Texas may 23 decertify an independent organization that does not comply with 24 Section 39.151, Utilities Code, as amended by this Act.

25 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
