4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:						
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 1001, Health and Safety Code, is amended						
6	by adding Subchapter I-1 to read as follows:						
7	SUBCHAPTER I-1. MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAMS FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT						
8	Sec. 1001.231. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:						
9	(1) "Law enforcement officer" means a persor						
10	identified as a peace officer under Article 2.12(1), (2), (3), or						
11	(4), Code of Criminal Procedure.						
12	(2) "Peer" means a person who is a law enforcement						
13	officer or a law enforcement officer's family member.						
14	Sec. 1001.232. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The						
15	executive commissioner shall develop a mental health intervention						
16	program for law enforcement officers. The program must include:						
17	(1) peer-to-peer counseling;						
18	(2) access to licensed mental health professionals for						
19	peer service coordinators and peers;						
20	(3) training approved by the commission for peer						
21	service coordinators, licensed mental health professionals, and						
22	peers;						
23	(4) technical assistance for peer service						
24	<pre>coordinators, licensed mental health professionals, and peers;</pre>

- 2 community-based licensed mental health professionals;
- 3 (6) suicide prevention training for peer service
- 4 coordinators and peers; and
- 5 (7) coordination of mental health first aid for law
- 6 enforcement officers and immediate family members of law
- 7 <u>enforcement officers.</u>
- 8 (b) As part of the mental health intervention program the
- 9 executive commissioner shall develop a mental health initiative for
- 10 law enforcement officers serving in rural jurisdictions.
- 11 <u>(c)</u> The commission shall solicit and ensure that
- 12 specialized training is provided to persons who are peers and who
- 13 want to provide peer-to-peer counseling or other peer-to-peer
- 14 services under the program.
- 15 (d) The executive commissioner may adopt rules necessary to
- 16 <u>implement this subchapter.</u>
- 17 Sec. 1001.233. ANNUAL REPORT. Not later than December 1 of
- 18 each year, the executive commissioner shall submit a report to the
- 19 governor and the legislature that includes:
- 20 (1) the number of law enforcement officers who
- 21 received services through the mental health intervention program
- 22 for law enforcement officers;
- 23 (2) the number of peers and peer service coordinators
- 24 trained;
- 25 (3) an evaluation of the services provided under this
- 26 subchapter; and
- 27 (4) recommendations for program improvements.

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- 1 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2022, the executive
- 2 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 3 develop the mental health intervention program for law enforcement
- 4 officers, as required under Subchapter I-1, Chapter 1001, Health
- 5 and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
