5	SECTION 1. Section 39.03, Penal Code, is amended by
6	amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsections (e), (f), and (g) to
7	read as follows:
8	(d) Except as otherwise provided by this section, an [An]
9	offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
10	(e) An[, except that an] offense under this section is a
11	felony of the third degree if the public servant acted with the
12	intent to impair the accuracy of data reported to the Texas
13	Education Agency through the Public Education Information
14	Management System (PEIMS) described by Sections 48.008 and 48.009,
15	Education Code, under a law requiring that reporting.
16	(f) An offense under this section is a felony of the second
17	degree if the public servant, at the time of the commission of the
18	offense, was a licensed peace officer and:
19	(1) caused bodily injury to another or threatened
20	another with imminent bodily injury; and
21	(2) while engaging in the conduct described by
22	Subdivision (1):
23	(A) caused serious bodily injury to another; or

(B) used or exhibited a deadly weapon.

- 1 (g) If conduct constituting an offense under this section
- 2 also constitutes an offense under another section of this code, the
- 3 actor may be prosecuted under either section or both sections.
- 4 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 6 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 7 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 8 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 9 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 10 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 11 before that date.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
