APPLICATION FOR EXTREME RISK PROTECTIVE ORDER. 19 (a) An application for a protective order under this subchapter may 20 be filed by: 21 (1) a member of the respondent's family or household; 22 23 (2) a parent, guardian, or conservator of a person who 24 is under 18 years of age and a member of the respondent's family or

13	(d) An applicant described by Subsection (a)(3), before
14	filing an application under this subchapter or promptly following
15	filing the application, shall make a good faith attempt to notify a
16	member of the respondent's family or household and any other person
17	that the applicant believes may be at risk as a result of the
18	respondent's dangerous behavior or conduct of:
19	(1) the application filed or the applicant's intent to
20	file an application under this subchapter; and
21	(2) available mental health, family violence, and
22	counseling resources.
23	Art. 7B.153. CONFIDENTIALITY OF CERTAIN INFORMATION. On
24	receiving an application containing specific medical or mental
25	health information concerning the respondent, the court shall order
26	the clerk to:
27	(1) strike the information from the public records of

3	for use only by the court.

5	finds from the information contained in an application for a

7	cause to believe that the respondent poses an immediate and present

9	any person, including the respondent, as a result of the
10	respondent's serious mental illness and access to firearms, the
11	court, without further notice to the respondent and without a
12	hearing, may issue a temporary ex parte order prohibiting the
13	respondent from purchasing, owning, possessing, or controlling a
14	<u>firearm.</u>
15	(b) In a temporary ex parte order, the court may order the
16	respondent to:
17	(1) relinquish, without delay, any firearms owned by
18	or in the actual or constructive possession or control of the
19	respondent to a law enforcement agency for holding in the manner
20	provided by Article 18.192;
21	(2) if applicable, surrender to the court the
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21	respondent's license to carry a handgun issued under Subchapter H,
22	respondent's license to carry a handgun issued under Subchapter H,

24	respondent's serious mental illness and access to firearms, the
25	court shall issue a protective order that includes a statement of
26	the required finding.
27	(e) If the court does not make the finding described by

2	any temporary ex parte order issued under Article 7B.154 and return
3	the respondent's license to carry a handgun.
4	Art. 7B.156. CONTENTS OF PROTECTIVE ORDER. In a protective
5	order issued under Article 7B.155, the court shall:
6	(1) prohibit the person who is subject to the order
7	from purchasing, owning, possessing, or controlling a firearm for
8	the duration of the order;
9	(2) order the person to:
10	(A) relinquish, without delay, any firearms
11	owned by or in the actual or constructive possession or control of
12	the person to a law enforcement agency for holding in the manner
13	provided by Article 18.192;
14	(B) if applicable, surrender to the court the
15	person's license to carry a handgun issued under Subchapter H,
16	Chapter 411, Government Code; and
17	(C) if applicable, receive outpatient mental
18	health services if recommended by the local mental health authority

2	original expiration date. Before renewing the order the court must
3	hold a hearing and provide personal notice of the hearing to the
4	person who is the subject of the order.
5	(c) A person who is the subject of a protective order may
6	file a motion not earlier than the 91st day after the date on which
7	the order was initially issued or renewed, as applicable,
8	requesting that the court review the order and determine whether
9	there is a continuing need for the order. After a hearing on the
10	motion, if the court fails to make the finding that there is no
11	continuing need for the order, the order remains in effect until the
12	date the order expires as provided by this article.
13	(d) At a hearing to renew or rescind a protective order
14	under this article, the court shall consider the factors described
15	by Article 7B.155(c).

15	issuing court shall notify the Department of Public Safety of the
16	expiration.
17	Art. 7B.159. APPLICATION OF OTHER LAW. Except as otherwise
18	provided by this subchapter and to the extent applicable, Title 4,
19	Family Code, applies to a protective order issued under this
20	subchapter.
21	SECTION 2. Chapter 18, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
22	amended by adding Article 18.192 to read as follows:
23	Art. 18.192. HOLDING AND DISPOSITION OF FIREARM
24	RELINQUISHED UNDER EXTREME RISK PROTECTIVE ORDER. (a) A law
25	enforcement officer who takes possession of a firearm from a person
26	who is the subject of an extreme risk protective order issued under
27	Subchapter D, Chapter 7B, shall immediately provide the person a

1	written copy of the receipt for the firearm and a written notice of
2	the procedure for the return of a firearm under this article.
3	(b) Not later than the seventh day after the date a firearm
4	subject to disposition under this article is received, the law
5	enforcement agency holding the firearm shall notify the court that
6	issued the extreme risk protective order that the person who is the
7	subject of the order has relinquished the firearm.
8	(c) Not later than the 30th day after the date the extreme
9	risk protective order is rescinded or expires, the clerk of the
10	court shall notify the law enforcement agency of the rescission or
11	expiration.
12	(d) Not later than the 30th day after the date the law
13	enforcement agency holding a firearm subject to disposition under
14	this article receives the notice described by Subsection (c), the
15	law enforcement agency shall conduct a check of state and national
16	criminal history record information to verify whether the person
17	may lawfully possess a firearm under 18 U.S.C. Section 922(g) and

18 <u>under the law of this state.</u>

19 (e) If the check conducted under Subsection (d) verifies 20 that the person may lawfully possess a firearm, the law enforcement 21 agency shall provide to the person by certified mail written notice 22 stating that the firearm may be returned to the person if the person 23 submits a written request before the 121st day after the date of the 24 notice.

25 (f) An unclaimed firearm that is received under an extreme 26 risk protective order issued under Subchapter D, Chapter 7B, may 27 not be destroyed or forfeited to the state. 1(g) The law enforcement agency holding the firearm may2provide for the firearm to be sold by a person who is a licensed3firearms dealer under 18 U.S.C. Section 923 if:4(1) the check conducted under Subsection (d) shows

5 that the person who was the subject of the extreme risk protective
6 order may not lawfully possess a firearm; or

7 (2) the notice is provided under Subsection (e) and
8 the person who was the subject of the extreme risk protective order
9 does not submit, before the 121st day after the date of the notice,
10 a written request for the return of the firearm.

11 (h) The proceeds from the sale of a firearm under this 12 article shall be paid to the owner of the seized firearm, less the 13 cost of administering this article with respect to the firearm.

14 (i) A law enforcement officer or other employee of a law 15 enforcement agency is subject to punishment for contempt of court 16 if the officer or employee violates this article with the intent to 17 withhold a firearm from a person who, at the time the violation 18 occurred:

19 (1) was the subject of an extreme risk protective 20 order that was rescinded or that expired; and

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(2) may lawfully possess the firearm.

22 SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 411, Government Code, is 23 amended by adding Section 411.0522 to read as follows:

1 D, Chapter 7B, Code of Criminal Procedure, to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for inclusion in the National Instant Criminal 2 3 Background Check System. 4 (b) The procedure must require the department to provide any 5 information received under Article 7B.158, Code of Criminal Procedure, to the Federal Bureau of Investigation not later than 6 7 the 30th day after the date the department received the 8 information. 9 SECTION 4. 9 (11) has not been finally determined to be delinquent 10 in the payment of a tax or other money collected by the comptroller, 11 the tax collector of a political subdivision of the state, or any 12 agency or subdivision of the state;

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(12) is not currently:

(A) restricted under a court protective order,
 including an extreme risk protective order issued under Subchapter
 D, Chapter 7B, Code of Criminal Procedure; or

(13) has not, in the 10 years preceding the date of

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officer a false statement relating to a request that a prosecuting

attorney file an application for an extreme risk protective order 1 under Subchapter D, Chapter 7B, Code of Criminal Procedure. 2 3 (c) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor. SECTION 7. 9 SECTION 8. Section 46.06, Penal Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective 10 date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of 11 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was 12 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that 13 14 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed 15 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date. 16

SECTION 9. Not later than October 1, 2021, the Department of Public Safety shall adopt rules as required by Section 411.0522, Government Code, as added by this Act.

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SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
