(a) 10 Notwithstanding any other law, the commission shall provide medical 11 assistance to all persons who apply for that assistance and for whom 12 federal matching funds are available under the Patient Protection 13 14 and Affordable Care Act (Pub. L. No. 111-148), as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010 (Pub. L. No. 15 16 111-152), to provide that assistance. (b) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules regarding 17 the provision of medical assistance as required by this section. 18 Sec. 32.352. ANNUAL <u>REPORT ON EXPANDED ELIGIBILITY FOR</u> 19 MEDICAL ASSISTANCE. Not later than December 1 of each year, the 20 commission shall report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, 21 the speaker of the house of representatives, and the standing 22 23 committees of the senate and the house of representatives having primary jurisdiction over the medical assistance program on the 24

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1 effects of expanding eligibility for medical assistance under 2 Section 32.351, including the effects on: 3 (1) the number of persons in this state who do not have 4 health benefits coverage; 5 (2) state health care costs, including costs relating 6 to programs funded with money appropriated out of the general 7 revenue fund;

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(3) local health care costs; and

9 (4) charity care and uncompensated care costs for 10 hospitals.

11 SECTION 2. Section 32.351, Human Resources Code, as added 12 by this Act, applies only to an initial determination or 13 recertification of eligibility of a person for medical assistance 14 under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, made on or after January 1, 15 2022, regardless of the date the person applied for that 16 assistance.

17 SECTION 3. As soon as possible after the effective date of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human 18 Services Commission shall take all necessary actions to expand 19 eligibility for medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human 20 21 Resources Code, in accordance with Section 32.351, Human Resources Code, as added by this Act, including notifying appropriate federal 22 23 agencies of that expanded eligibility. If before implementing any 24 provision of this Act a state agency determines that any other waiver or authorization from a federal agency is necessary for 25 26 implementation of that provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or authorization and may delay 27

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1 implementing that provision until the waiver or authorization is 2 granted.

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3 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect January 1, 2022, but only 4 if the constitutional amendment proposed by the 87th Legislature, 5 Regular Session, 2021, requiring the state to expand eligibility 6 for Medicaid to all persons for whom federal matching funds are 7 available under the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care 8 Act is approved by the voters. If that amendment is not approved by 9 the voters, this Act has no effect.
