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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the maternal mental health peer support pilot program for perinatal mood and anxiety disorder. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 32, Health and Safety Code, is amended by 5 adding Subchapter G to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER G. MATERNAL MENTAL HEALTH PEER SUPPORT PILOT PROGRAM 7 Sec. 32.201. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 8 9 (1) "Peer support service" means a service provided by a peer support specialist to a person with a mental illness or 10 substance use condition in accordance with commission rules 11 regarding peer specialists. 12 13 (2) "Perinatal mood and anxiety disorder" includes any 14 of the following psychiatric illnesses, as defined by the American Psychiatric Association in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of 15 Mental Disorders (DSM), that occur during pregnancy or within 12 16 17 months postpartum: 18 (A) bipolar disorder, including hypomanic, manic, depressive, and mixed types; 19 20 (B) major depressive disorder, including 21 single-episode and recurrent types; 22 (C) generalized anxiety disorder; 23 (D) obsessive-compulsive disorder; 24 (E) paranoid or other psychotic disorder; and

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1	(F) post-traumatic stress disorder.
2	(3) "Pilot program" means the maternal mental health
3	peer support pilot program established under this subchapter.
4	Sec. 32.202. ESTABLISHMENT OF PILOT PROGRAM. (a) The
5	commission shall establish and operate the maternal mental health
6	peer support pilot program to reduce the risk and manage the effects
7	of perinatal mood and anxiety disorders in women through the
8	delivery of peer support services at federally qualified health
9	centers located in the geographic areas in which the pilot program
10	operates.
11	(b) The commission shall establish the pilot program in five
12	counties in this state that:
13	(1) either:
14	(A) are within an area designated as a mental
15	health professional shortage area; or
16	(B) have high rates of maternal mortality and
17	morbidity as determined by the commission in consultation with the
18	Texas Maternal Mortality and Morbidity Review Committee; and
19	(2) include at least one rural county and one county
20	with a population of at least 500,000.
21	Sec. 32.203. OPERATION OF PILOT PROGRAM. (a) In
22	establishing the pilot program, the commission shall:
23	(1) develop a strategy for federally qualified health
24	centers participating in the pilot program and persons responsible
25	for training to collaborate on the training, certification, and
26	guidance of peer support specialists in accordance with existing
27	state procedures and programs;

S.B. No. 147 1 (2) seek comments regarding best practices for the 2 design and implementation of the pilot program from relevant interested persons, including federally gualified health centers, 3 mental health care providers, local mental health authorities, 4 5 certified peer support specialists and affiliated organizations, women's health care providers, and individuals who have personal 6 7 experience with perinatal mood and anxiety disorders; (3) develop specialized training to: 8 (A) identify and treat symptoms of perinatal mood 9 10 and anxiety disorders; and (B) provide peer support services to pregnant 11 12 women and new mothers; (4) develop a strategy for federally qualified health 13 14 centers and peer support specialists participating in the pilot 15 program to provide peer support services through any form of 16 telephonic communication; 17 (5) develop in collaboration with the federally qualified health centers participating in the pilot program a 18 19 strategy to integrate the delivery of peer support services with the health care services provided by the centers to women during 20 pregnancy and within one year of giving birth; 21 (6) create for the federally qualified health centers 22 participating in the pilot program a protocol for referring to peer 23 24 support services women who are diagnosed as having or identified as being at risk of developing a perinatal mood and anxiety disorder; 25 26 (7) ensure the services provided by peer support specialists under the pilot program are within the scope of a duty 27

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1	of care prescribed by commission rule for peer support specialists
2	who provide similar services; and
3	(8) develop a method for collecting data, including by
4	consulting with the Texas Maternal Mortality and Morbidity Review
5	Committee and other relevant entities regarding the data, on:
6	(A) maternal health and mental health outcomes;
7	and
8	(B) substance use by women receiving peer support
9	services through the pilot program.
10	(b) A peer support specialist who provides peer support
11	services through the pilot program at a federally qualified health
12	center shall:
13	(1) provide peer support services to women who:
14	(A) based on the results of a postpartum
15	depression screening or other screening tool, are diagnosed as
16	having or identified as being at risk of developing a perinatal mood
17	and anxiety disorder; and
18	(B) are interested in receiving peer support
19	services; and
20	(2) through the use of the specialist's personal
21	experience with perinatal mood and anxiety disorders:
22	(A) provide guidance to the women;
23	(B) if necessary, advocate for the women to
24	receive mental health care services or other specialized health
25	care services; and
26	(C) provide the women with information on mental
27	health care resources as necessary.

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1 Sec. 32.204. FUNDING. In addition to money appropriated by the legislature, the commission may accept gifts, grants, and 2 donations from any source for establishing the pilot program and 3 compensating peer support specialists under the pilot program. 4 Sec. 32.205. REPORT. Not later than January 1, 2023, the 5 6 commission shall prepare and submit to the governor, lieutenant 7 governor, and legislature a written report that: (1) evaluates the success of the pilot program in 8 reducing perinatal mood and anxiety disorders and substance use in 9 10 women who received peer support services under the pilot program; and 11 12 (2) recommends whether the pilot program should be continued, expanded, or terminated. 13 14 Sec. 32.206. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires September

15 <u>1, 2025.</u>

16 SECTION 2. (a) Not later than December 31, 2021, the 17 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission 18 shall adopt rules as necessary to establish the maternal mental 19 health peer support pilot program as required by Subchapter G, 20 Chapter 32, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.

(b) Not later than June 30, 2022, the Health and Human Services Commission shall establish the maternal mental health peer support pilot program as required by Subchapter G, Chapter 32, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
