## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the employment of certified school counselors by school

3 districts.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 33.002, Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

Sec. 33.002. [CERTIFIED] SCHOOL COUNSELOR TO STUDENT RATIO;
DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS FOR COUNSELING PROGRAMS. (a) In this
section, "school counselor" means a school counselor certified
under Subchapter B, Chapter 21.

11 (a-1) From funds appropriated for the purpose or other funds 12 that may be used for the purpose, the commissioner shall distribute funds for programs under this subchapter. In distributing those 13 14 funds, the commissioner shall give preference to [a school district that received funds under this subsection for the preceding school 15 16 year and then to] the districts that have the highest concentration of students at risk of dropping out of school, as described by 17 Section 29.081. To receive funds for the program, a school district 18 must apply to the commissioner. For each school year that a school 19 20 district receives funds under this subsection, the district shall 21 allocate an amount of local funds for school guidance and counseling programs that is equal to or greater than the amount of 22 23 local funds that the school district allocated for that purpose during the preceding school year. Funds distributed under this 24

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1 subsection are in addition to any other funds available for
2 programs under this subchapter, including funds provided under
3 Section 48.2641 [This section applies only to a school district
4 that receives funds as provided by this subsection].

5 (b) <u>Beginning with the 2029-2030 school year, a</u> [A] school 6 district with <u>300</u> [<del>500</del>] or more students <u>in enrollment</u> [<del>enrolled in</del> 7 <del>elementary school grades</del>] shall employ a school counselor 8 [<del>certified under the rules of the State Board for Educator</del> 9 <del>Certification</del>] for each [<del>elementary</del>] school in the district. A 10 school district shall employ at least one school counselor for 11 every 300 [<del>500 elementary school</del>] students in the district.

12 (b-1) Beginning with the 2027-2028 school year, a school 13 district with 350 or more students in enrollment shall employ a 14 school counselor for each school in the district. A school district 15 shall employ at least one school counselor for every 350 students in 16 the district. This subsection expires September 1, 2029.

17 (b-2) Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, a school 18 district with 400 or more students in enrollment shall employ a 19 school counselor for each school in the district. A school district 20 shall employ at least one school counselor for every 400 students in 21 the district. This subsection expires September 1, 2027.

22 (b-3) Beginning with the 2023-2024 school year, a school 23 district with 450 or more students in enrollment shall employ a 24 school counselor for each school in the district. A school district 25 shall employ at least one school counselor for every 450 students in 26 the district. This subsection expires September 1, 2025.

27 (b-4) A school district with 500 or more students in

5	(c) Beginning with the 2029-2030 school year, a [A] school
6	district with fewer than <u>300</u> [ <del>500</del> ] students <u>in enrollment</u> [ <del>enrolled</del>
7	in elementary school grades] shall provide guidance and counseling
8	services to [ <del>elementary school</del> ] students by:
9	(1) employing a part-time school counselor [ <del>certified</del>
10	under the rules of the State Board for Educator Certification];
11	(2) employing a part-time teacher certified as a
12	school counselor under <u>Subchapter B, Chapter 21</u> [ <del>the rules of the</del>
13	State Board for Educator Certification]; or
14	(3) entering into a shared services arrangement
15	agreement with one or more school districts to share a school
16	counselor [ <del>certified under the rules of the State Board for</del>
17	Educator Certification].
18	(c-1) Beginning with the 2027-2028 school year, a school
19	district with fewer than 350 students in enrollment shall provide
20	guidance and counseling services to students by:
21	(1) employing a part-time school counselor;
22	(2) employing a part-time teacher certified as a
23	school counselor under Subchapter B, Chapter 21; or
24	(3) entering into a shared services arrangement
25	agreement with one or more school districts to share a school
26	counselor.
27	(c-2) Subsection $(c-1)$ and this subsection expire September

2	(c-3) Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, a school
3	district with fewer than 400 students in enrollment shall provide
4	guidance and counseling services to students by:
5	(1) employing a part-time school counselor;
6	(2) employing a part-time teacher certified as a
7	school counselor under Subchapter B, Chapter 21; or
8	(3) entering into a shared services arrangement
9	agreement with one or more school districts to share a school
10	counselor.
11	(c-4) Subsection $(c-3)$ and this subsection expire September
12	<u>1, 2027.</u>
13	(c-5) Beginning with the 2023-2024 school year, a school
14	district with fewer than 450 students in enrollment shall provide
15	guidance and counseling services to students by:
16	(1) employing a part-time school counselor;
17	(2) employing a part-time teacher certified as a
18	school counselor under Subchapter B, Chapter 21; or
19	(3) entering into a shared services arrangement
20	agreement with one or more school districts to share a school
21	counselor.
22	(c-6) Subsection (c-5) and this subsection expire September
23	<u>1, 2025.</u>
24	(c-7) A school district with fewer than 500 students in
25	enrollment shall provide guidance and counseling services to
26	students by:
27	(1) employing a part-time school counselor;

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1	(2) employing a part-time teacher certified as a
2	school counselor under Subchapter B, Chapter 21; or
3	(3) entering into a shared services arrangement
4	agreement with one or more school districts to share a school
5	<u>counselor.</u>
6	(c-8) Subsection (c-7) and this subsection expire September
7	<u>1, 2023.</u>
8	SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter $48$ , Education Code, is
9	amended by adding Section 48.2641 to read as follows:
10	Sec. 48.2641. ADDITIONAL STATE AID FOR CERTIFIED SCHOOL
11	COUNSELORS. (a) For each school year, from funds that may be used
12	for the purpose, a school district is entitled to state aid in an
13	amount, as determined by the commissioner, sufficient to assist the
14	district in employing the number of certified school counselors
15	required by Section 33.002.
16	(b) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to
17	administer this section.
18	SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
19	school year.
20	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
21	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
22	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
23	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
24	Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
